



TB Cases and Incidence Oregon, 1985-2004




TB Cases by County of Residence Oregon, 2004






TB Cases by Gender & Age Oregon, 2004




TB Cases by Race & Ethnicity Oregon, 2004




TB Case Rates by Race & Ethnicity Oregon, 2004




TB Cases by Origin Oregon 1995-2004




Foreign Born TB Cases by Country Oregon, 2004



Pediatric TB Cases Oregon, 1995-2004




TB/HIV Co-Morbidity Oregon, 1995-2004




Homelessness in TB Cases




TB Cases in Correctional Facilities Oregon 2000-2004

TB Drug Resistance Patterns Oregon 2004

- Zero (0%) Multi-drug resistant (MDR) cases
MDR = isoniazid (INH) and rifampin (RM) resistant
- 17 (18%) Resistant to at least one TB drug
 - 8 (9%) at least INH resistant
 - 12 (13%) at least streptomycin resistant(n=93 culture positive cases)
