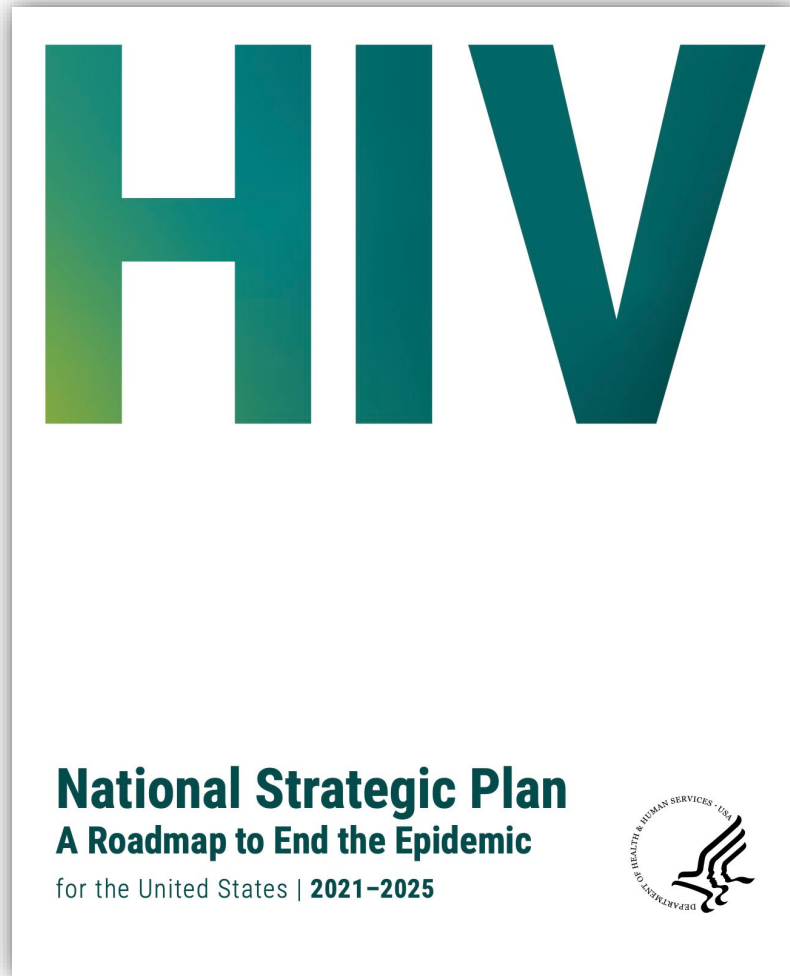

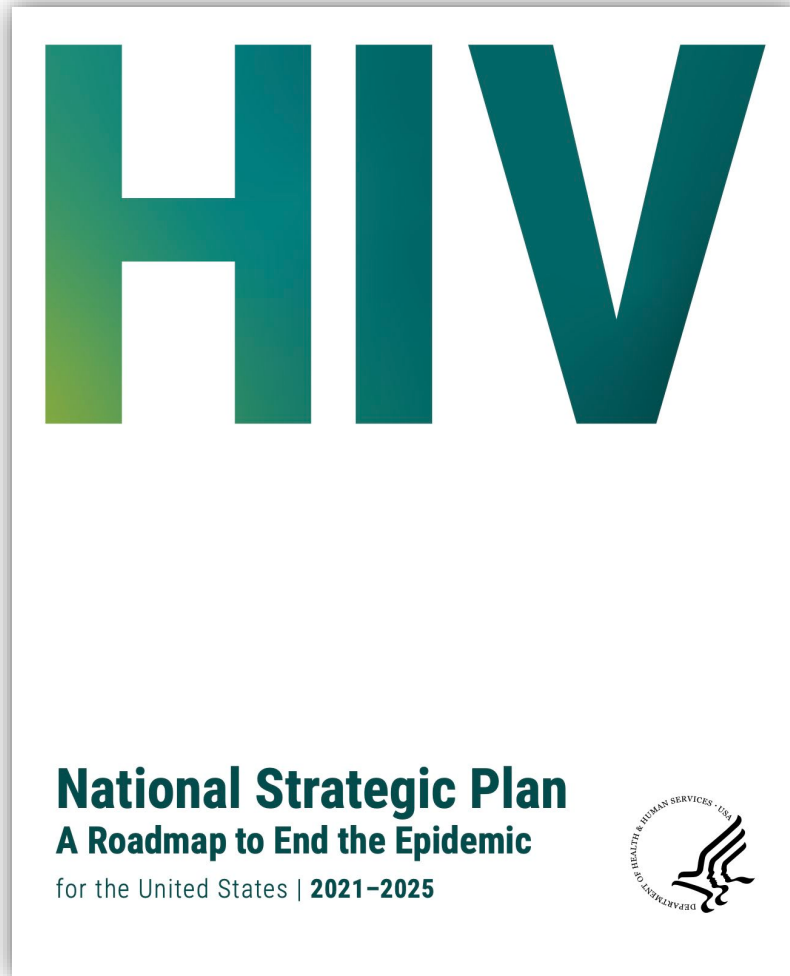
HIV National Strategic Plan



- Prevent new HIV infections
- Improve HIV-related health outcomes of people with HIV
- Reduce HIV-related disparities and health inequities
- Achieve integrated and coordinated goals that address the HIV epidemic among all partners and stakeholders



HIV National Strategic Plan



The HIV Plan:

- Articulates objectives and strategies for each goal
- Identifies priority populations disproportionately impacted by HIV
- Sets forth indicators to monitor progress, including disparities indicators to measure progress toward reducing significant HIV-related disparities





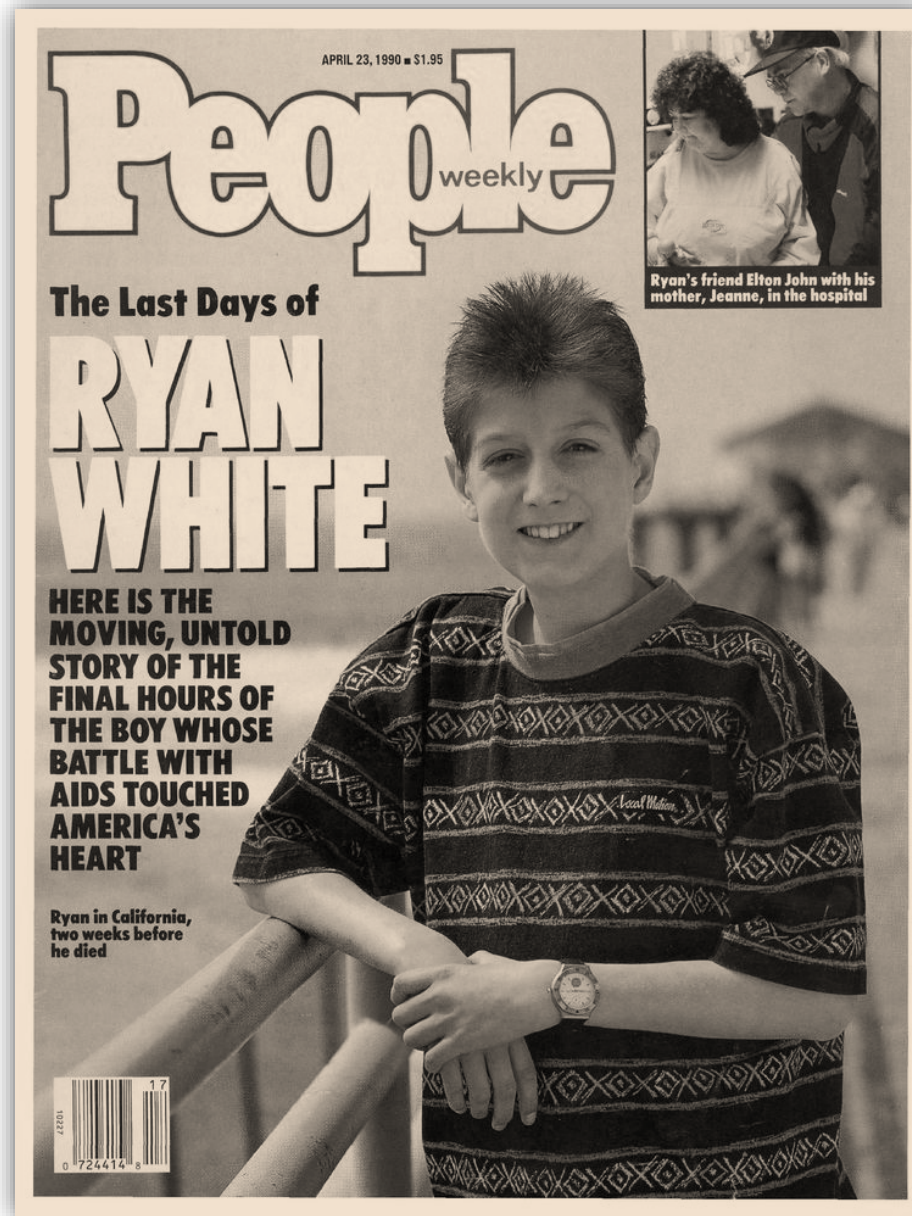

History of Ryan White

Named after a child from Indiana who contracted HIV and developed AIDS after a blood transfusion in 1984, when he was 13 years old.





History of Ryan White



When parents and administrators were fearful that he might infect students, he was suspended from school.

Ryan and his mother fought for him to be allowed to continue going to school and drew national attention in their public education and advocacy efforts.

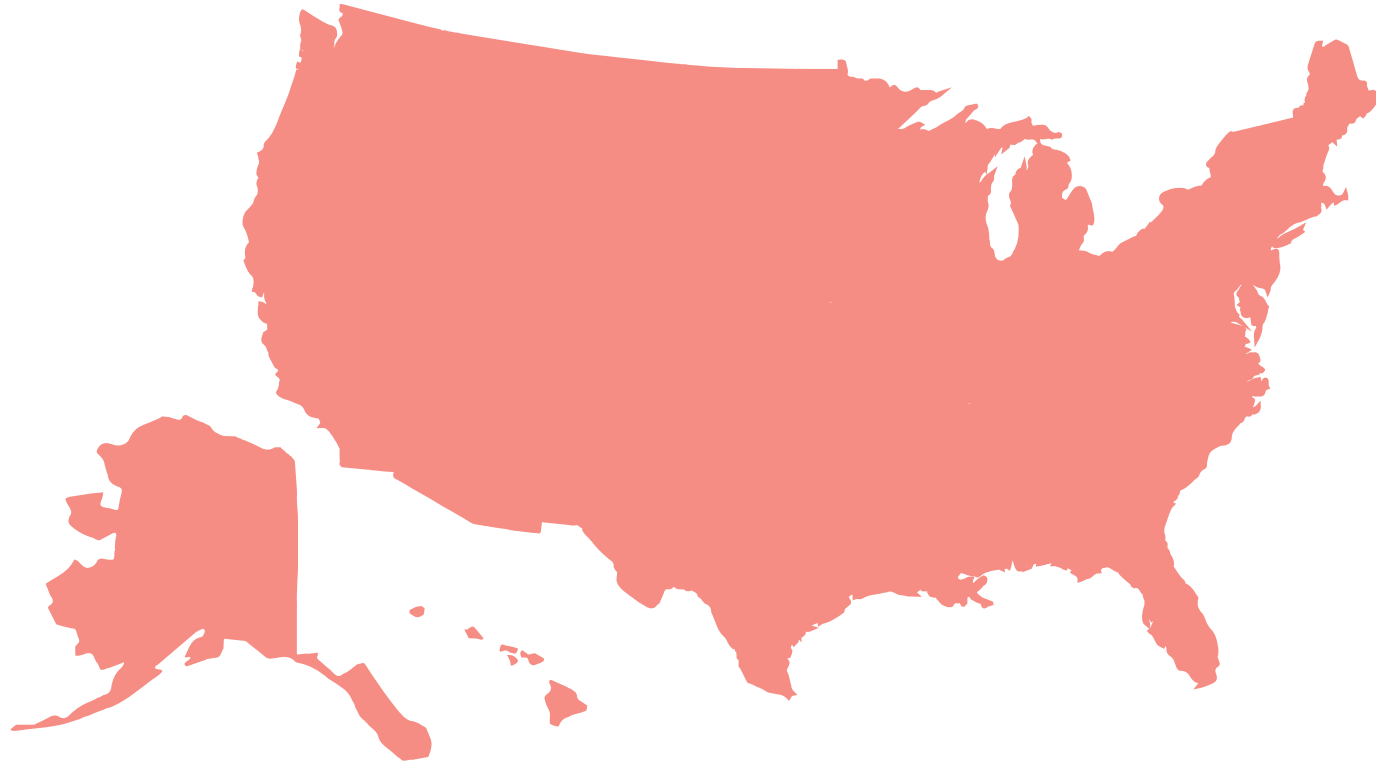
History of Ryan White

Congress continues to appropriate funding for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program, which provides a comprehensive system of HIV primary medical care, essential support services, and medications for low-income people living with HIV.





Ryan White HIV Program



Nationally, the Ryan White program funds primary care and support services for more than

500,000

individuals each year who lack health insurance and financial resources for their care.

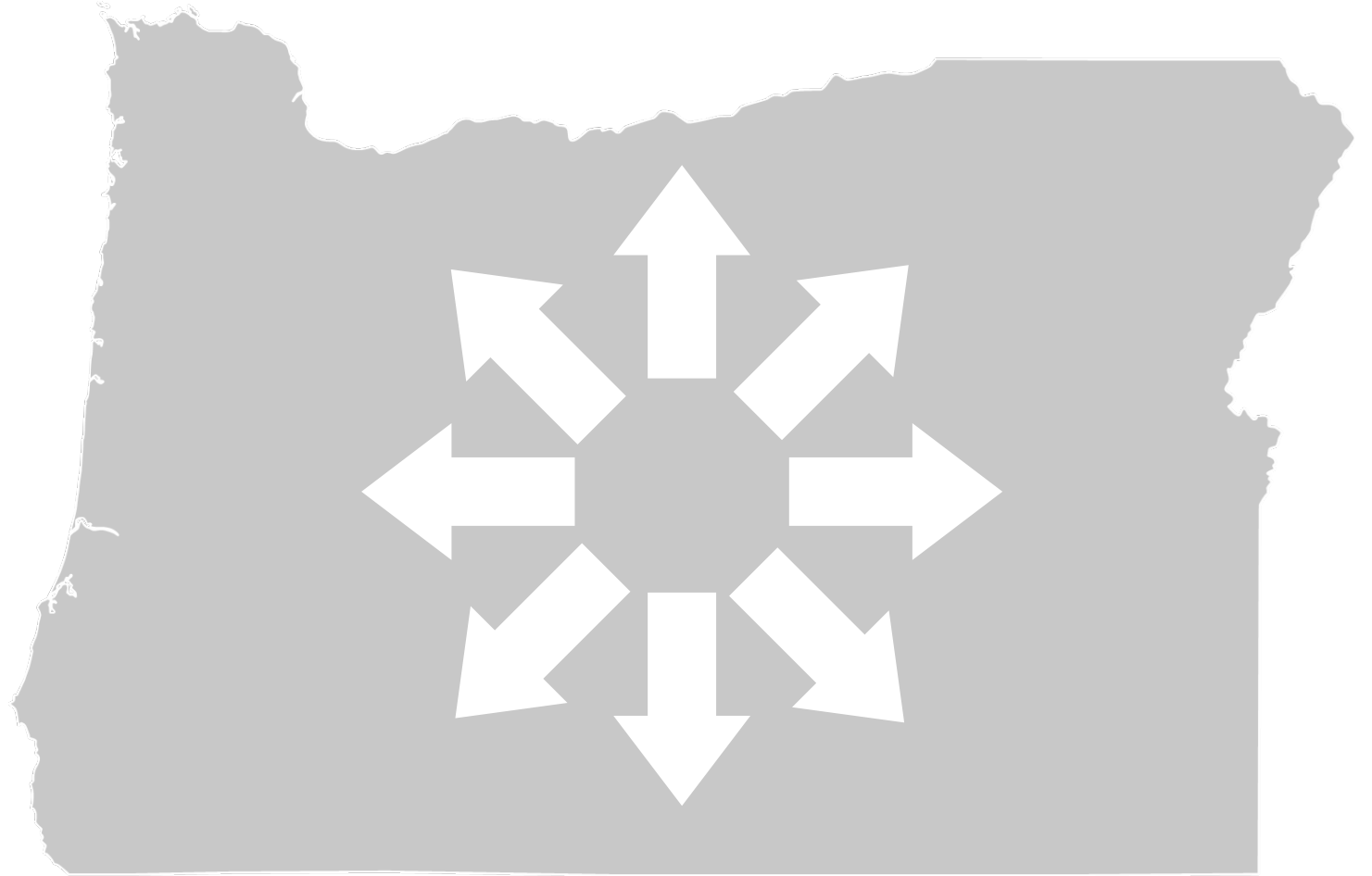
Part B grants are awarded to states to improve the quality, availability, and organization of HIV health care





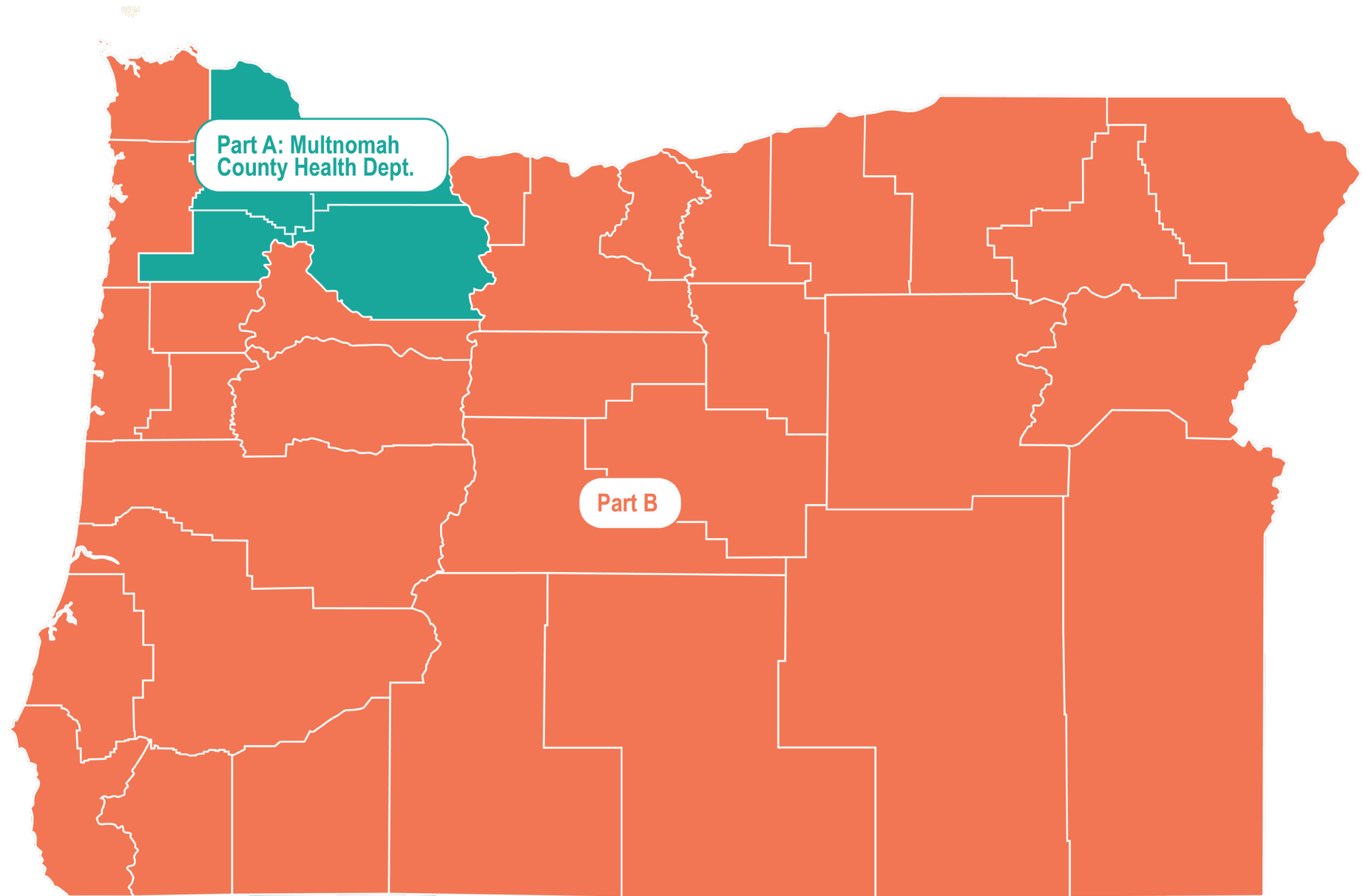

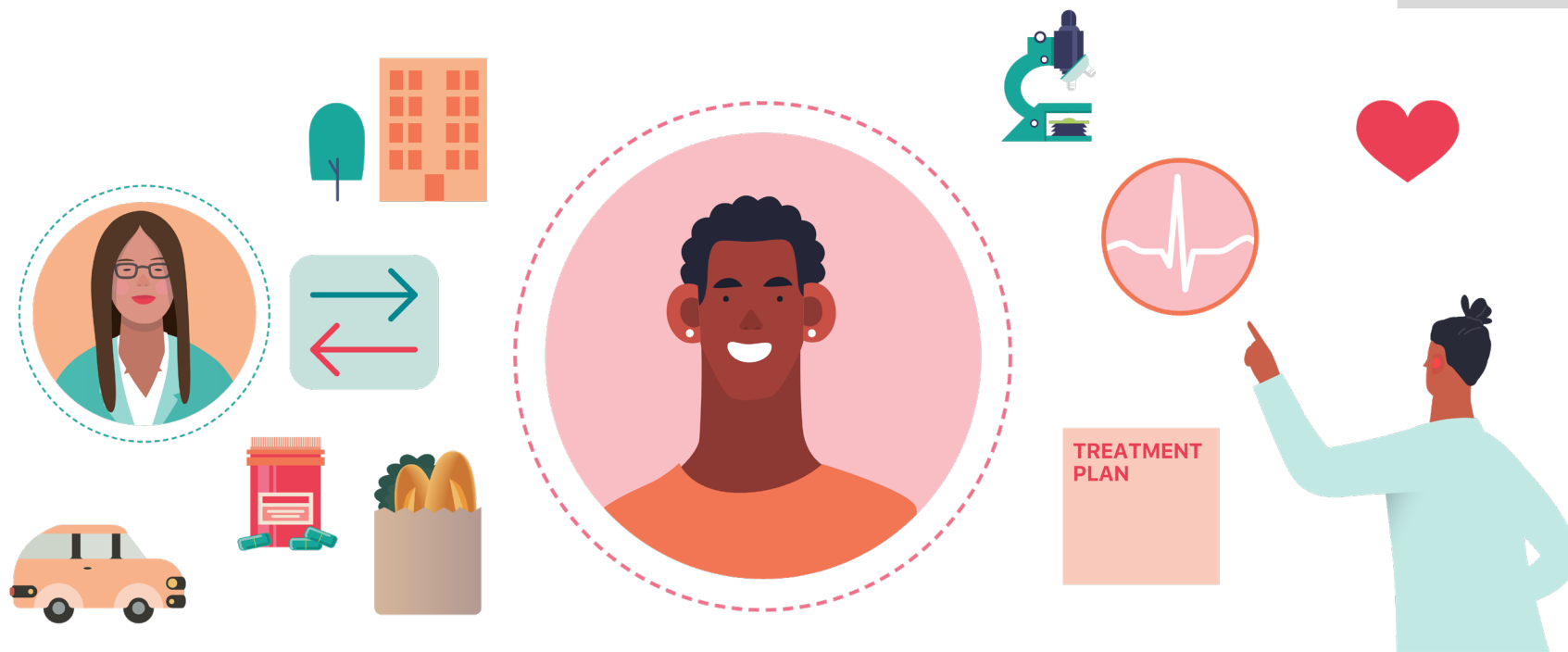
Oregon Health Authority

CAREAssist provides access to life-saving medications used to treat HIV and improve the overall health of people living with HIV who have limited resources or no health insurance coverage



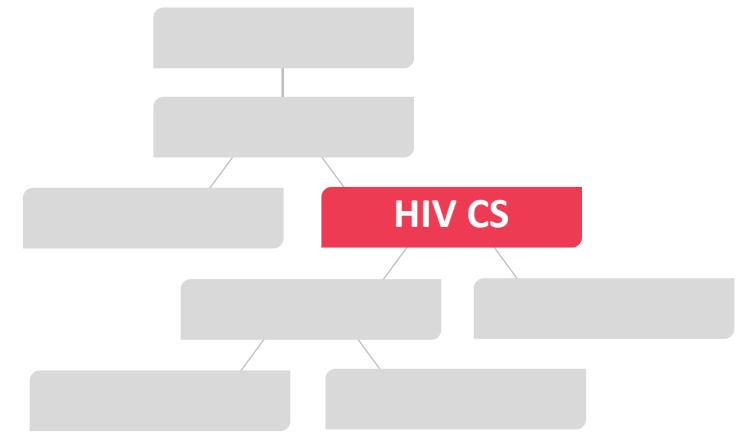

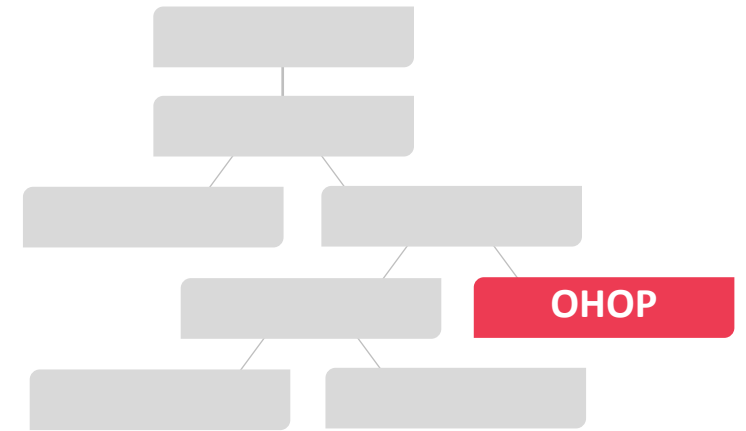


The HIV Community Services Program addresses the needs of persons with HIV





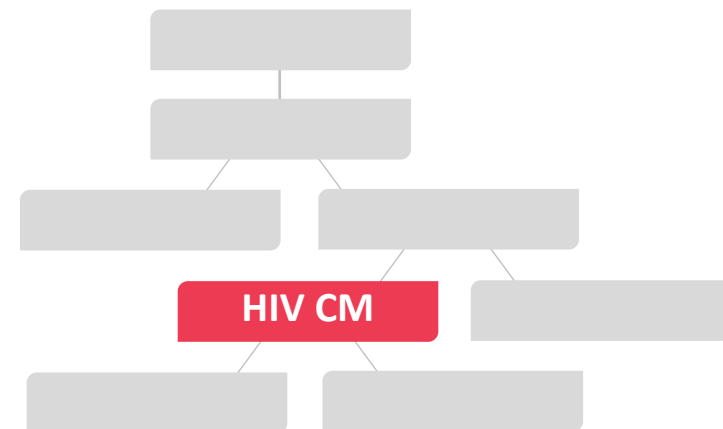
Oregon Housing Opportunities in Partnership

Case management goals are to improve access to and retention in needed medical and support services to mitigate and eliminate barriers to HIV care services.

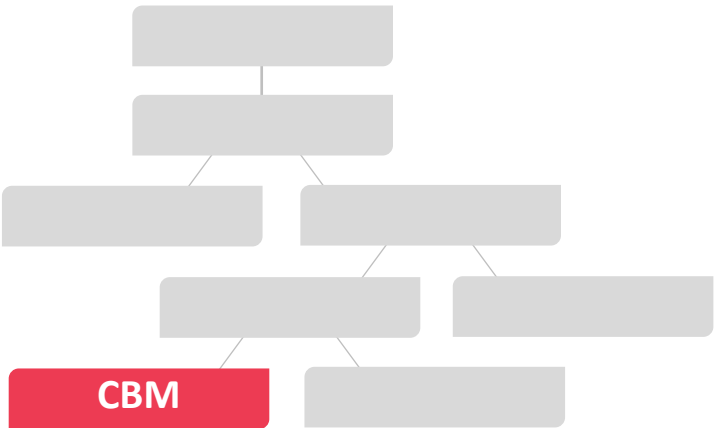




County based model

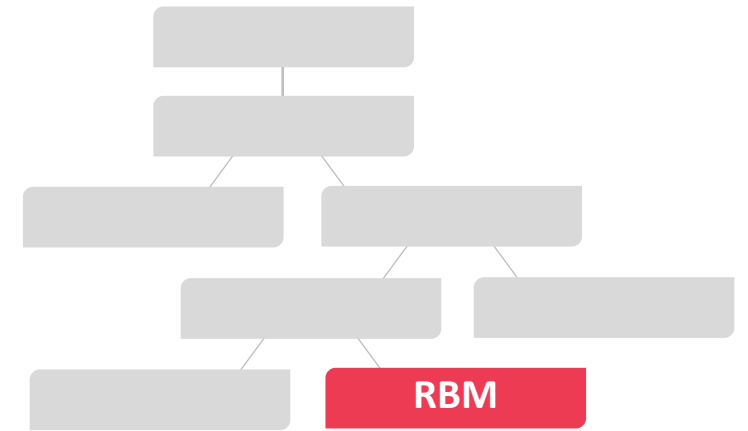


Local health departments provide case management services





Regional based model

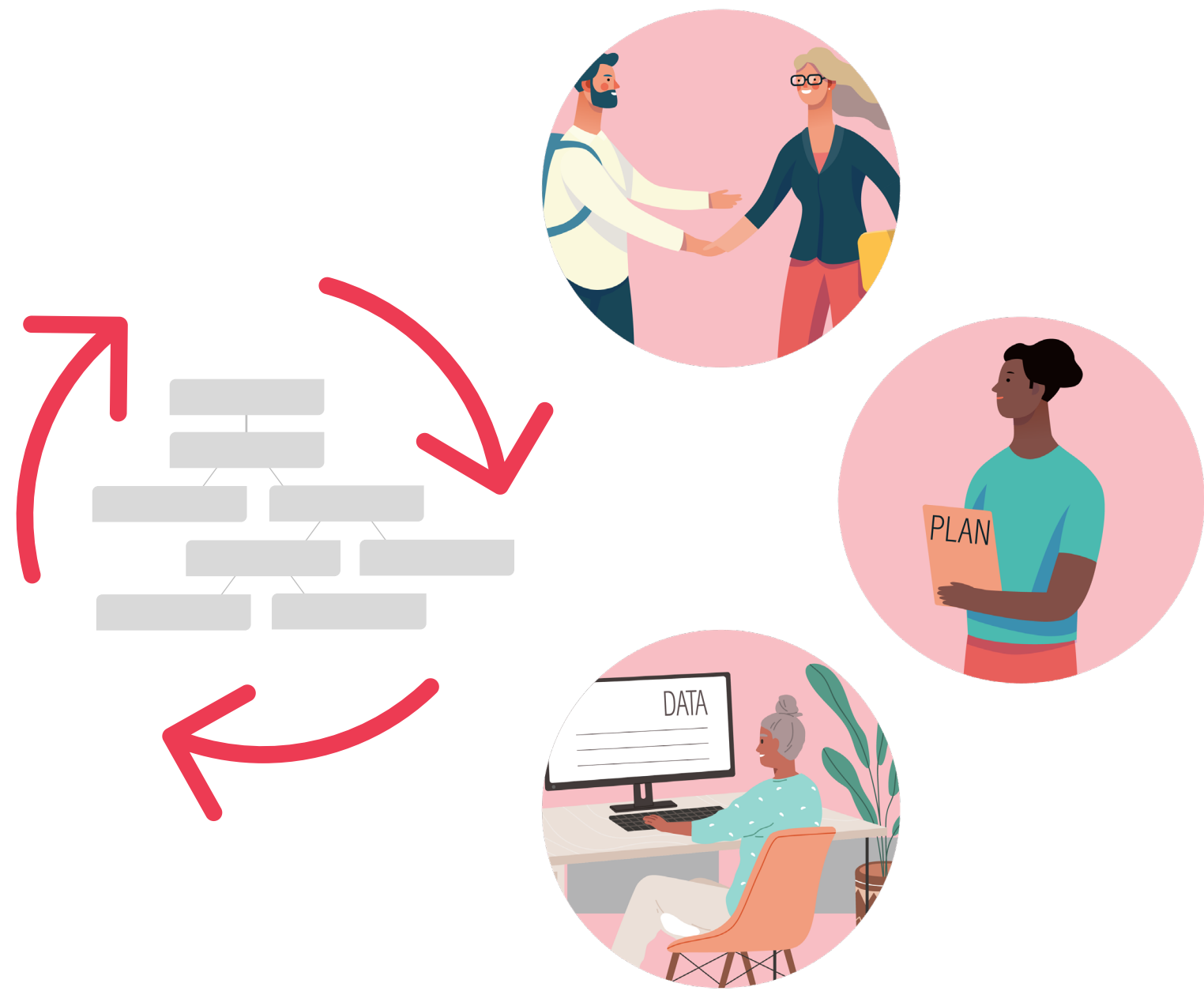


Community-based organizations provide case management services



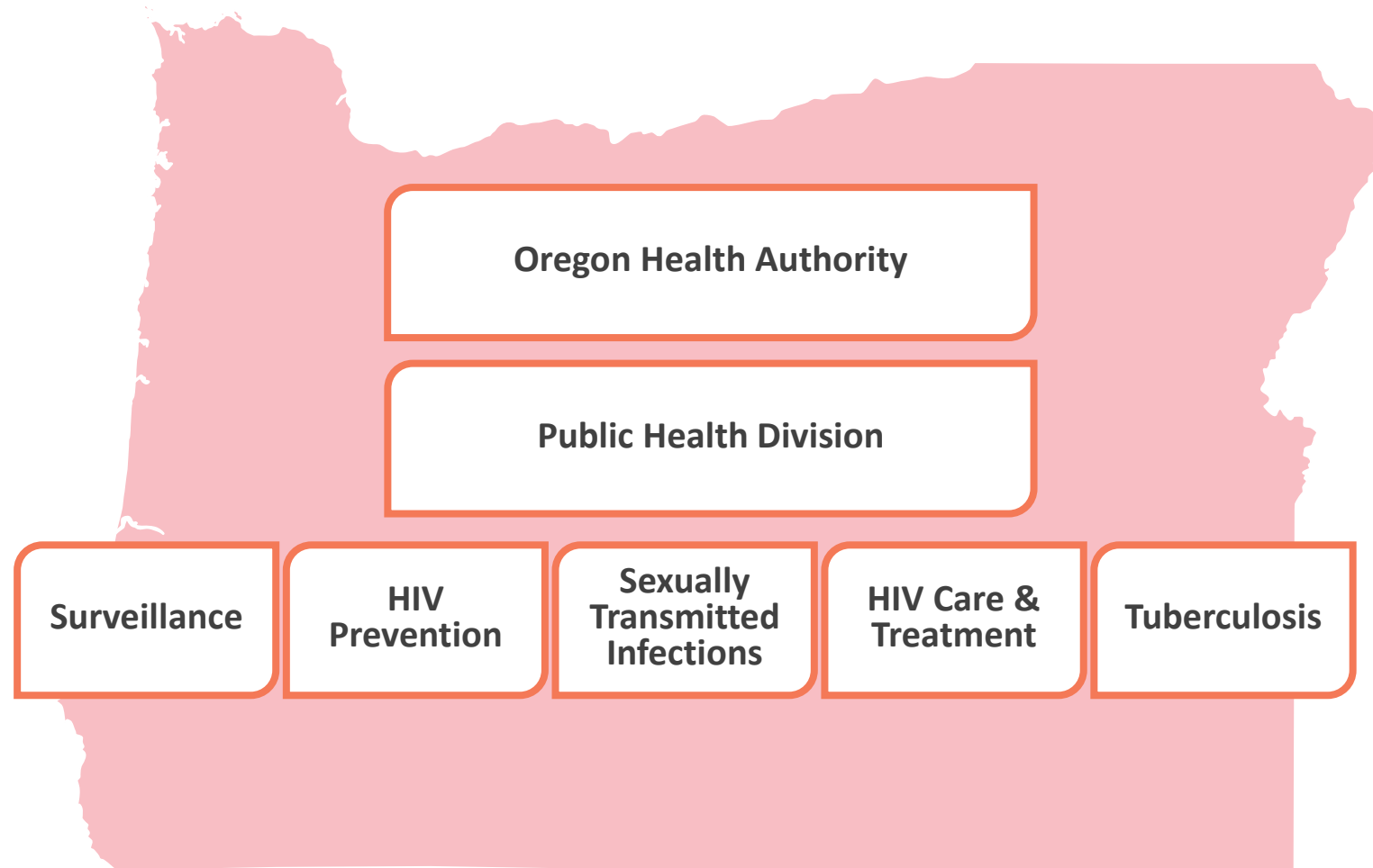
