

Billing for STD treatment and management services

This fact sheet explains how local county health departments can bill the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) for STD treatment and management services provided to Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members with fee-for-service physical health coverage.

To learn how to bill the member's coordinated care organization (CCO), contact the CCO.

Billable services

Bill for services to treat or manage gonorrhea, chlamydia and syphilis as listed in the following table.

- For STD treatment, only bill for administration of injectable medications (e.g., ceftriaxone for gonorrhea, bicillin for syphilis). Do not bill for medications provided or funded by the Oregon STD program.
- For partner notification, these services are billable to OHP through the member (not the partner) because they are part of the member's treatment (e.g., to reduce risk of reinfection or infection from another STD).

Treatment and management for partners

Following partner notification, you may bill OHA or the CCO for screening and treatment of partners from their first encounter when their test is positive **and** the partner is an OHP member.
