


Environmental Finance Center Network

RCAC Programs

- Communities <10,000 population
- Preference for <3,300 population
- Some contracts require community be low income
- Most federal contracts have certain number of projects, trainings that are designated for tribal populations



Financing assistance

- RCAC housing, environmental infrastructure or community facilities, and small business financing
- Community development loans available to Tribes, Tribal entities and individuals in the Southwest
- Small business
 Re-Emerging Loan Fund
 (RELieF)
- USDA Rural Development Section 502 Loan Packaging program





Housing services

- RCAC affordable housing assistance
- Tribal Housing Excellence Academy (THE Academy), housing and development assistance on Tribal lands

- USDA Rural Development Mutual Self-Help Housing






Building Rural Economies

Trains and builds community support for local entrepreneurial development

In Fiscal Year 2023, the Building Rural Economies team served 96 projects and supported 108 rural businesses through one-on-one coaching


Free Training

- Where: Blue River, McKenzie Valley, Lane County, Oregon
- Problem: Small rural communities struggle to obtain the emergency funding required to replace critical infrastructure destroyed by wildfires.
- Solution: Rural Community
 Assistance Corporation
 (RCAC) provided technical
 assistance that allowed the city
 to access FEMA emergency
 funds.







Sun Country Estates Maintenance Association

- Where: Yakima, Yakima County, Washington (4th Congressional District)
- Problem: Small rural water and wastewater systems struggle to access funding for critical upgrades and replacements of capital infrastructure.
- Solution: Rural Community
 Assistance Corporation (RCAC)
 completed a Median Household
 Income (MHI) survey to broaden
 access to funding opportunities.



Deer Island Village

- Where: Deer Island Village, Columbia County, Oregon
- Problem: Small water systems lack the technical, financial and managerial capacity to manage their systems.
- Solution: Rural Community
 Assistance Corporation
 provides technical assistance
 to ensure compliance with
 regulations.
