## **Public Review and Comment Period**

Legal notice of public review and comment period concerning proposed changes to the combined Project Priority List (PPL) for Oregon's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) for the end of Quarter 1, state fiscal year 2026. This portion of the combined PPL is specific to the <u>Sustainable Infrastructure Planning Projects (SIPP)</u> program.

One of Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Drinking Water Services (DWS) responsibilities as a state agency managing the DWSRF program as set forth under Section 1452 (40 CFR 35.555 (b)) of the amended 1996 Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) is to provide the public the opportunity to comment on changes to the Intended Use Plan (IUP) as a part of the grant application process to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The PPL is important to how the DWSRF program implements the IUP. SIPP projects are related to stand-alone drinking water system planning activities that promote sustainable water infrastructure. Engineering and construction activities are ineligible. The projects are rated (i.e., scored) to determine ranking and placement on the PPL. Funding for ready-to-proceed eligible projects will be in the form of 100% forgivable loan between \$20,000 to \$50,000 depending on the project type.

The public review and comment period for proposed changes to the PPL will be from Wednesday, October 8 through Friday, October 17, 2025. ## Notes:

This Project Priority List (PPL) will include all applications submitted by the Sustainable Infrastructure Planning Projects (SIPP) Program deadline in the state fiscal year (SFY) 2026 (7/1/25 - 6/30/26). Applications are typically accepted twice per SFY, on August 15th and February 15th. Because funding for this program is dependent on funding availability and due to the overwhelming interest during the August 15th, 2025 round of projects, the February 15th, 2026 round is unfortunately closed. The next deadline for SIPP applications is August 15th, 2026.

\*\*The state has allocated a maximum of \$500,000 per state fiscal year in forgivable loans from Oregon's Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund Program (SDWRLF).

Seismic Risk Assessment and Mitigation Plans (SRAMP) projects are rated on whether they meet the 5 eligibility criteria for an SRAMP project and are part of a full water master plan submittal. They do not receive a point score and are included in a separate table above.

All other SIPP projects are rated based on criteria that include system size, readiness to proceed, infrastructure project potential, and history of previous capital improvement projects (CIP). These projects receive a score based on these criteria and are placed in rank order in the table above.

The above PPL table typically includes projects submitted by the August deadline in ranked order first and submitted by the February deadline second. As noted above, due to the overwhelming interest during the August 15th, 2025 round, the PPL tables above only show what was submitted during that August round as the February round is unfortunately closed.

If a submitted project is deemed ineligible for SIPP, then it is listed below.

When more than one project submitted in the same quarter receives the same rating score, applicants that meet the SDWRLF Disadvantaged Community (DAC) definition will be ranked higher among those projects.

Funding is recommended for projects on a first-come, first-served basis, based on the following order until the funding limit has been met: SRAMP projects are funded first, followed by the rank order of projects submitted in the 1st quarter, and finally those submitted in the 3rd quarter, if applicable.

Projects not recommended for funding may reapply in the following state fiscal year to be considered for funding.
