# Round 2 Funding at a Glance

- Designed to serve Individuals with Disabilities and Older Adults.
- Recipient households must be at or below 80% area median income.
- 20% Cap on administrative expenses.

# Program Purpose & Goals



## **Improve Health & Housing Conditions**

Address deferred maintenance and health hazards in homes occupied by low-income households across Oregon.



## **Support Accessibility**

Prioritize accessibility modifications and aging-in-place improvements for individuals with disabilities and older adults (55+).



## **Advance Health Equity**

Serve communities impacted by environmental justice factors to reduce health disparities.

# Round 2 Funding Priorities

Organizations with proven track record serving low-income households.

Organizations with direct experience with home repair/modification programs.

Organizations with direct experience serving individuals with disabilities or older adults.

Service areas with high need and limited resources (rural/frontier).

Ability to leverage other funding sources.

Specific accommodations for renters.

Use of Whole-Home or Aging-in-Place assessments.

Recognition of intersectionality in health and housing inequity.

# Who This Funding Serves



## Individuals with Disabilities

Persons with physical or mental impairments that substantially limit one or more major life activities — including mobility, sensory, cognitive, and chronic health conditions.

*\*Refer to ADAAA (2008) for full definition.*



## Older Adults (Age 55+)

Seniors face elevated risks from aging housing stock including falls, respiratory illness, and heat/cold-related health hazards. HHGP supports aging-in-place and independent living.

**Serving Low-Income Households at or below 80% of Area Median Family Income (HUD definition, by county & household size)**

# What Funding Can Be Used For — Eligible Activities

**Priority consideration for applications emphasizing accessibility improvements and aging-in-place modifications for individuals with disabilities and older adults.**

## Safety & Structure

- Accessibility modifications (ramps, grab bars, door widening)
- Structural repairs (foundation, roofing)
- Electrical system upgrades
- HVAC replacement or repair
- Insulation and air sealing
- Window and door replacement
- Ventilation improvements

## Health Hazards

- Lead abatement
- Mold and mildew abatement
- Radon abatement
- Asthma and allergen trigger removal
- Smoke filtration and air purification
- Integrated pest management
- Safety enhancements (smoke/CO detectors)

## Energy & Assessment

- Energy audits and home hazard assessments
- Energy efficiency upgrades
- Heat reduction strategies (cool roofs, vegetation)
- Whole-Home and Older Adult Home Safety Assessments

# What Funding Cannot Be Used For — Ineligible Uses



**New housing construction or development**



**Purchase of real estate**



**Purchase of vehicles**



**Direct medical care or medical supplies**



**Purchase of appliances**



**Rent, mortgage, utilities, phone, or internet payments for individuals**



**More than 20% of award on administration**

# What Your Application Must Include (Not an exhaustive list!)

## Part 1 – Organization Information

- Entity type and EIN
- Contact and contract administrator info
- Confirmation of insurance requirements
- OregonBuys vendor ID (or ability to register)
- Nonprofit Letter of Determination (if applicable)

## Part 2 – Project Description

- Project overview, need, and approach
- Counties and populations served
- Number of households anticipated

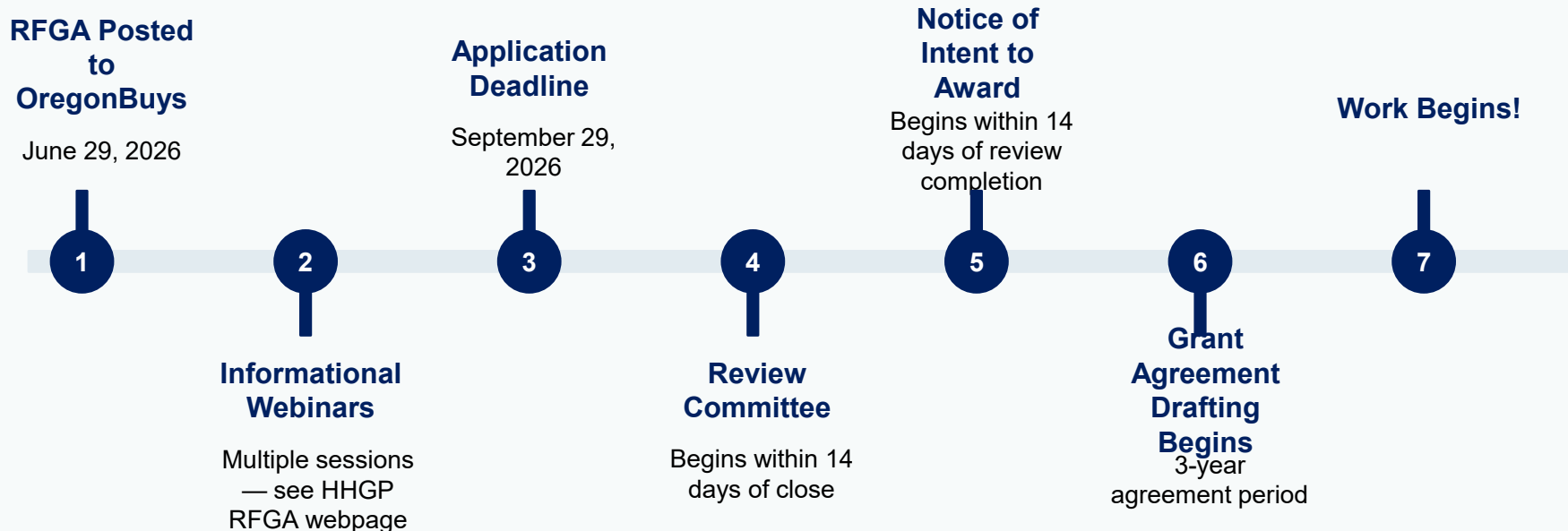
## Part 3 – Budget & Partnerships

- Proposed Budget Template (Excel, Attachment #1)
- Plan to leverage additional funds
- Other funding sources identified or pursued

## Part 4 – Work Plan

- At least one SMART outcome and progress measure- *What do you hope you accomplish, and how will you measure it?*
- Selected Healthy Homes activities
