

**Oregon Health Authority  
Toxic-Free Cosmetics Program  
Rules Advisory Committee (RAC) Charter**

**Purpose:** The Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Toxic-Free Cosmetics Program is seeking stakeholder input to implement provisions of [SB 546](#), passed during the 2023 Oregon Legislative Session, and referred to as the *Toxic-Free Cosmetics Act*.

OHA adopts Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) under the authority granted by Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) [431A.330 through 431A.349](#) to implement the *Toxic-Free Cosmetics Act*.

Each organization on the RAC may have only one active participant per meeting. Others in the organization may listen in but should remain silent. Alternate representatives are welcome with a few days' notice so materials can be sent in advance.

**Outcomes:** This workgroup will provide OHA with recommendations and feedback on OAR amendments relating to:

8. OAR 333-016-4060 List of Prohibited Chemicals, Subclasses or Classes of Chemicals
9. OAR 333-016-4075 List of Prohibited Intentionally Added Chemicals or Classes of Chemicals: Practical Quantification Limits
10. OAR 333-016-4080 Enforcement and Civil Penalties

**Timeline:** These changes are anticipated to be adopted/take effect by January 1, 2027.

**Decision-Making:** OHA will make every effort to achieve consensus on rule recommendations. Consensus will be achieved when all workgroup members:

- Have an opportunity to share their opinions and concerns;
- Agree that the decision was arrived at fairly and openly; and
- Can and will support the decision even if not their preferred choice.

If consensus cannot be reached, OHA will make the final decisions.

**Responsibilities of Members:** Each workgroup member is responsible for communicating with and collecting input from the organizations they represent. Members should also commit to attend each meeting.

**Interested Parties (IPs) and Colleagues of Active Participants** are invited to observe/listen in on RAC meetings but will not be invited to participate in discussions. OHA will provide in writing, meeting highlights, action items and decisions reached, and will facilitate the sharing of information.
