

Tracking Home Visiting Effectiveness in Oregon (THEO) Monthly Status Update

March 2019

Tracking Home Visiting Effectiveness in Oregon (THEO) is a data system that collects home visiting data, provides case management features, and tells the story of home visiting services.

Project Status Early Adoption began March 8th with Family Building Blocks EHS and HFA programs.

What to Expect- THEO Key Features

- Home visitors will have a user dashboard to help them manage reporting schedules, tasks that are due, and provide links to the records for each of their clients.
- Home visitors with MIECHV families will have automated schedule reminders and alerts for reporting MIECHV data.
- Ability to build customized surveys allowing THEO to collect any data points about a client. The THEO MCH Project team will be available to work collaboratively with agencies to build out surveys that will support agency data collection needs and goals.
- Case Management and Care Plan
 - Allows for specifying content based on the home visiting model and client demographics (for example, parent-specific forms vs child-specific forms)
 - Allows for collecting other program content like client goals and opportunities as part of the care plan.
 - Home visitors can document visits and contacts with their families in a note that locks with the user's name and date-time stamp.
