Objective

To provide commercial health benefit plan partners a monthly standardized update about the latest developments in Family Connects Oregon (FCO).

Status Update

- Happy new fiscal year and biennium! The 2025-2027 Family Connects Oregon Case Rate went into effect on July 1, 2025.
 - Beginning July 1, 2025, the FCO case rate for commercial claims is \$1856. The
 case rate for Pre-IHVs only is \$427. In the case of families with multiple infants (e.g.
 twins, triplets), the case rate is \$297 per additional infant.
- As of July 1, 2025, carriers will need to discontinue contracts with Crook County and transfer contracts over to Jefferson County, who will be serving the Crook County area.
- Our next commercial insurance carrier call is on Tuesday, July 15 at 1:05p on Microsoft Teams. We will have some FCO updates as well as Reed presenting an update on FCO's Communication project!

FCO Site Launch Updates

- Lane County Public Health began offering services on November 1, 2024.
- Yamhill County Public Health began offering services on January 1, 2025.
- o Polk County Health Department began offering services on February 1, 2025.
- United Community Action Network (UCAN; Douglas County) began offering services on February 1, 2025.
- South Coast is planning to offer services in Coos County starting in late 2025.
- o Multnomah County is planning to offer services starting in late 2025.
