

Monitoring-Screening-Assessment



Developmental Monitoring

Observes how [a] child grows and changes over time and whether [a] child meets the typical developmental milestones.

<u>Screening</u> Is not diagnostic-meaning the result or outcome of screening is not to provide any kind of diagnosis.

Assessment

A systematic procedure to identify the specific needs of a child or family for the purpose of intervention.







