



## Reproductive Health Program Information Sheet

### Reproductive Health Program Talking Points

- The Oregon Reproductive Health (RH) Program works with over 100 clinics across the state to offer free or low-cost reproductive health services and birth control.
- The RH Program manages funding to cover services for low-income people who can get pregnant or get someone else pregnant, regardless of immigration status, sex, or gender identity. Especially for those who don't qualify for the Oregon Health Plan (OHP).
- Individuals can enroll and get services the same day.
- Most services will be free at clinics within our clinic network. Clinic staff should tell the client up front if there is a charge.
- Regardless of insurance/funding people can access high quality services at RH Program clinics.

### Additional Information on RH Program Services

#### **What types of services are available at RH Program clinics?**

All services are voluntary and confidential.

- Birth control & condoms
- Women's check-ups, including breast exams and Pap tests
- Emergency contraception
- Pregnancy tests
- Abortion (available at specific contracted providers)
- Screening for sexually transmitted infections
- Vasectomy (available at some clinics)

#### **Who is eligible for RH Program coverage?**

- Low-income individuals who can get pregnant OR get someone else pregnant. Most anyone under 250% of the Federal Poverty Level or one person is likely eligible for free reproductive health services
- The Reproductive Health Program's network of clinics serve individuals regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability or immigration status.
- RH Program clinics serve youth and men.

- Enrollment and eligibility for RH Program coverage is determined at the clinic site at the time of the appointment.

### **Additional Information on Other RH Services**

#### **What other types of RH services are available?**

Tubal ligations

- In addition to OHP and private insurance, coverage for tubals is now available through CAWEM.

Postpartum care

- Clients enrolled in CAWEM Plus now also have coverage for full medical care for 60-days postpartum in addition to prenatal care and labor and delivery. This coverage includes postpartum check-ups, dental, vision, immediate postpartum tubal ligations, and immediate postpartum contraception (like IUDs and implants).

#### **Who is eligible for coverage of these services?**

- CAWEM and CAWEM Plus coverage is for clients who qualify for emergency coverage such as DACA recipients and people without documentation.
- Clients who make less than 138% of the Federal Poverty Level can be enrolled into CAWEM.
- Pregnant clients who make less than 185% of the Federal Poverty Level can be enrolled into CAWEM Plus.

#### **How can clients access these services?**

- Clients need to fill out an OHP application to be enrolled into CAWEM or CAWEM Plus.
- Once someone is enrolled in CAWEM or CAWEM+, they can go to any provider who accepts OHP fee-for-service (or “open card” members) and offers tubal ligation services. They do not need a referral from a RH Program clinic.
- Not all OHP providers accept fee-for-service. Clients can call the OHP Nurse Advice Line 1-800-562-4620 for help finding a fee-for-service provider.
