



ECTOPIC PREGNANCY

An ectopic pregnancy, sometimes called a tubal pregnancy, happens if a fertilized egg (embryo) starts to grow outside the uterus, often in the fallopian tube.

It is important for you to know the signs of an ectopic pregnancy as it requires emergency care.

Signs to look for:

- Vaginal bleeding
- Dizziness or fainting
- Belly pain or pelvic pain
- Shoulder pain
- Nausea and vomiting with pain

Seek medical care if you have any signs or symptoms!
