Introduction

This resource guide consists of detailed information on medical providers and community-based service organizations for all 36 counties in Oregon.

The main intended audience for this resource guide is Oregon Reproductive Health Services Certified Providers. These certified providers are recipients of state or federal monies provided for reproductive health services via a program administered by the Oregon Health Authority's Reproductive Health Program. However, the information in this resource guide should prove useful to varied audiences and community organizations throughout the state.

The primary goal is to identify reproductive health services providers and potential collaborative partners in each county. Given the breadth of medical providers and community service organizations in Oregon, not every single medical clinic or non-profit could be identified or listed. Aside from a focus on reproductive health service providers, a health equity lens was applied during research to ensure that diverse types of agencies were searched for and included in the resource guide.

The research process for each county was the same. However, based on county geography and services available, the community profile of each county is organized slightly differently. If a type of given agency is missing in a county's profile, it is because that agency type was not found in that location during the research phase.

Research was conducted solely on-line. Agency contact information or services were not vetted via phone calls, e-mails, or personal contact. However, the vast majority of agencies listed have been certified via an alternative vetting process. For example, mammography facilities listed are either certified by the Food and Drug Administration or the American College of Radiology as high-quality service providers.

Since agencies often hold multiple certifications, and to avoid repetitive entries, all certifications are listed in one location with the agency contact information. Please look for these certifications as you read the resource guide. Given the variety of certification programs available, a list of definitions and funding streams frequently referenced in the resource guide has been provided.

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Frequently Referenced Terms and Their Definitions

General Definitions

- **Oregon Health Authority (OHA):** The Oregon state government agency responsible for most of Oregon's health-related programs including public health, behavioral health, and the state's Medicaid program.
- **Oregon Office of Rural Health (ORH):** Based out of the Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU), the ORH aids hospitals, clinics and communities in rural areas to strengthen the rural health care delivery system.
- **Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA):** A federal agency responsible for improving access to health services for people who are uninsured, isolated or medically vulnerable.
- **Coordinated Care Organizations (CCO):** A network of all types of health care providers who work together in their local communities to serve people who receive health care coverage under the Oregon Health Plan (Medicaid).
- **Unincorporated Area:** In law, an unincorporated area is a region of land that is not governed by a local municipal corporation; similarly an unincorporated community is a region of land that is not governed by its own local municipal corporation, but rather is administered as part of larger administrative divisions, such as a township, parish, borough, county, city, canton, state, province or country. (Wikipedia)
- **Regional Health Equity Coalitions (RHEC):** Collaborative, community-driven, cross-sector groups organized regionally to identify policy, system, and environmental solutions that increase health equity for underserved and underrepresented communities experiencing health disparities.
- **Health Care Safety Net:** Clinics, hospitals and providers who are willing to provide health services to the uninsured and underserved, thereby ensuring comprehensive health services for all regardless of income or insurance status.
- **Affordable Care Act (ACA):** A comprehensive health care reform law and its amendments. The law addresses health insurance coverage, health care costs, and preventive care.
- **Qualified Health Plans (QHP):** An insurance plan that is certified by the Health Insurance Marketplace, provides essential health benefits, follows established limits on cost-sharing and meets other requirements under the ACA.
- **Healthcare shortage areas** are two types of designations determined by HRSA.
 - Health professional shortage areas (HPSAs) designate geographic areas or subgroups of the populations or specific facilities within them as lacking professionals in primary care, mental health, or dental care. (Wikipedia)
 - Medically Underserved Areas and Populations (MUAs and MUPs) only designate geographic areas or populations, and only for their lack of access to primary care services. (Wikipedia)

MUAs have a shortage of primary care health services for residents within a geographic area such a county, a group of neighboring counties, a group of urban census tracts, or a group of county or civil divisions.

MUP are specific sub-groups of people living in a defined geographic area with a shortage of primary care health services. These groups may face economic, cultural, or linguistic barriers to health care. Examples include, but are not limited to, those who are homeless, low-income, Medicaid-eligible, Native American, or migrant farmworkers. (<http://bhw.hrsa.gov>)

Governance

- **Public Health Authority or State Health Department:** A public entity that provides public health services. It differs from a District Health Department in how its governing board is composed, has members appointed, and the ways it wields authority/makes decisions. Compared to a district health department that can only serve counties within its district, the public health authority is specifically authorized to provide services across the boundaries of the counties making up the authority. Generally, state public health departments operate out of a central location and have prime responsibility for health in the state. State Health Departments play a role in managing local health departments and implementing programs.
- **District Health Department, Public Health District or Regional Health District.** A public entity that provides public health services. It differs from a Public Health Authority in how its governing board is composed, has members appointed and the ways it wields authority/makes decisions. Its jurisdiction includes only the counties that make up the district. It cannot perform services outside the counties in the district. The National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), define a local health department as "an administrative or service unit of local or state government, concerned with health, and carrying some responsibility for the health of a jurisdiction smaller than the state." A district can include one or multiple county, city, metropolitan, tribal or town health departments. It is a municipal corporation imbued with the specific purpose of providing some type of health service. It is a form of local government that receives authority from the state.
- **Public Hospital District:** "Public Hospital Districts are community-created, governmental entities authorized by state law to deliver health services—including but not limited to acute hospital care—to district residents and others in the districts' service areas. Owned and governed by local citizens, hospital districts tailor their services to meet the unique needs of their individual communities." (www.awphd.org) A public hospital district is a type of public health district (described above).
- **Board of Health:** Can also be called a **Council of Health**. These boards govern state health departments.

Types of Organizations and Funding Categories

- **Community Health Center (CHC):** These are community-based and patient-directed organizations that serve populations with limited access to healthcare. Most CHC are either a Migrant Farmworker clinic and/or a FQHC (defined below). HRSA supported CHC must meet the following requirements: 1) located or serve a high-need area; 2) governed by a community board; 3) provide comprehensive primary health care; 4) provide services available to all; and 5) meet other performance accountability requirements. (www.cdc.gov)
- **School Based Health Center (SBHC):** Primary care clinics based on school campuses with an emphasis on prevention and early care. They generally operate as a partnership between the school district and a community health organization. (Wikipedia)
- **SHIP Hospitals:** This represents the Small Rural Hospital Improvement Grant and is supported by DHHS, HRSA, and the Office of Rural Health Policy. The grant assists eligible hospitals in meeting the costs of implementing data system requirements established under Medicare including improvements in value based purchasing programs (VBP), accountable care organizations (ACO), and payment bundling (PB).
- **Critical Access Hospital (CAH):** Rural community hospitals that receive cost-based reimbursement from the Center for Medicaid Services (CMS). The CAH designation is designed to reduce the financial vulnerability of rural hospitals and improves access to healthcare by keeping essential services in rural communities (Rural Health Information Hub).
- **Disproportionate Share Hospitals (DSH):** Hospitals that serve a significantly disproportionate number of low-income patients and receive payments from CMS to cover the costs of providing care to uninsured patients.
- **Rural Health Clinic (RHC):** The purpose of RHCs is to increase primary care services for Medicaid and Medicare patients in rural communities. RHCs can be public, nonprofit, or for-profit healthcare facilities, however, they must be in rural, underserved areas. The clinic must be staffed at least 50% of the time with a NP, PA, or CNM. RHCs are required to provide outpatient primary care services and basic laboratory services. The main advantage of RHC status is enhanced reimbursement rates for providing Medicaid and Medicare services. (Rural Health Information HUB)
- **Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC):** A reimbursement designation from the Bureau of Primary Health Care and CMS. They are community-based organizations that provide comprehensive primary and preventive care. They are also called Community/Migrant Health Centers (CHC/MHC) and 330-Funded Clinics. They are automatically designated as health professional shortage facilities.
- **FQHC Look-alike Clinic:** “Health Center Program look-alikes operate and provide services consistent with Health Center Program requirements. While look-alikes do not receive Health Center Program funding, they are eligible to apply to CMS for reimbursement under FQHC Medicare and Medicaid payment methodologies. Look-alikes are also eligible to purchase discounted drugs through the 340B Federal Drug

Pricing Program, receive automatic Health Professional Shortage Area designation, and may access National Health Service Corps providers.” (www.hrsa.gov)

- **Migrant Health Centers or CHC with Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Funding (MSFW):** These health centers provide comprehensive primary and preventive care to migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families regardless of immigration status. They are administered by the Office of Special Populations within the Bureau of Primary Health Care at HRSA. They are funded with federal grants under section 330(g) of the Public Health Services Act.

Funding Sources

- **Medicare:** An insurance program where medical bills are paid from trust funds which those covered have paid into. It serves people over 65 primarily, whatever their income, and serves younger disabled people and dialysis patients. Patients pay part of the cost through deductibles or small premiums. It is a federal program. (HHS.gov)
- **Medicaid:** An assistance program for low-income persons of every age. Patients usually pay no part of the costs for covered medical expenses. A small co-payment is sometimes required. Medicaid is a federal-state program and can vary from state to state. It is run by state and local governments within federal guidelines (HHS.gov).
- **Title X:** The only federal grant program dedicated solely to providing individuals with comprehensive family planning and related preventive health services. Priority is given to those with low income. It is administered by the Office of Population Affairs. (HHS.gov) Eligibility is based on household income and household size is self-reported. Client may not be denied services based on citizenship. Title X provides a framework for how services are delivered.
- **CCare:** Oregon ContraceptiveCare, or CCare, is a Medicaid-waiver program that expands Medicaid coverage for family planning services to men and women of reproductive capacity. Eligibility is based on the individual’s income and citizen/immigration status, and household status is based on IRS tax filing. CCare is a payer source (like insurance).
- **Family Planning Expansion Program (FPEP)** A state option to expand Medicaid coverage for family planning services. Historically, states could expand eligibility for family planning only by securing a special, time-limited waiver from CMS. With the passage of health care reform (ACA) states can expand their family planning program by making a permanent change to their Medicaid program.
- **Diagnosis Related Group (DRG):** This is a system to classify hospital cases into one of approximately 500 groups, also referred to as DRG, expected to have similar hospital resource use, developed by Medicare as part of the prospective payment system. These hospitals participate in the Oregon Hospital Tax program to fund the Oregon Health Plan.
- **Oregon Vasectomy Project (OVP):** “A state-funded program to increase capacity and access to free or low-cost vasectomy services to low-income men throughout the state.” (www.oregon.gov)

- **CAWEM/CAWEM Plus:** CAWEM is a benefit package that covers emergency medical services and pregnancy care for non-citizen, low-income Oregon residents. CAWEM Plus extends medical coverage for post-partum women for sixty days.
- **Oregon Health Plan (OHP):** OHP is Oregon's state Medicaid program. It provides medical coverage for low-income Oregonians.
- **Medicare Primary Care Initiative:** "The Comprehensive Primary Care Initiative is a partnership between Medicare and other insurance programs and organizations. The partnership is designed to help selected primary care providers and their practices provide additional resources to improve the quality of care. Primary care practices can use these resources to make improvements to their practice, like hiring new staff and updating technology to better coordinate their patients' care." (www.medicare.gov)

Credentialing Programs

- **Patient Centered Primary Care Home (PCPCH):** A recognition program for clinics that offer high-quality, patient-centered care. Run by the Transformation Center at OHA.
- **Primary Care Medical Home (PCMH):** A certification program sponsored by US Department of Human Services and AHRQ (Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality). The PCMH is also sometimes called the patient centered medical home, advanced primary care, or healthcare home.
- **Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA) Deemed:** The employees and contractors are considered federal employees and are therefore immune from lawsuits for medical malpractice.
- **FDA Certified Mammography Center:** Mammography centers that have been certified by the Food and Drug Administration as having met specific standards of high-quality.
- **Breast Imaging Center of Excellence:** The Breast Imaging Center of Excellence designation is awarded to imaging centers that achieve excellence by seeking and earning accreditation in all of the American College of Radiology volunteer breast imaging accreditation program modules, in addition to the mandatory Mammography Accreditation Program.

Special Programs

- **National Health Service Corps (NHSC):** NHSC helps place medical and dental students in rural locations and under-served areas for three-year commitments in exchange for loan repayment assistance and scholarships. Rural health organizations can apply to become NHSC sites.

Baker County Community Profile

The county seat and largest city is Baker City. As of the 2010 Census, Baker County had 16,134 residents. The racial makeup of the county was:

- 94.6% white
- 1.1% American Indian
- 0.5% Asian
- 0.4% black or African American
- 0.1% Pacific islander
- 1.0% from other races
- 2.4% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 3.3% of the population.

About 12.7% of families and 19.9% of the population were below the poverty line. In 2015, ORH estimated that 2.8 % of residents were uninsured, 27.7% were enrolled in OHP, and 20.6% lived in poverty.

Statistics on Oregon.gov indicate that three residents of Baker County had abortions from January to November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are zero FTE of OB/GYN. The eastern half of Baker County is considered a medically-underserved area.

The Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. High poverty hotspots are geographic concentrations of poor residents. Baker County has two hotspots, both situated in and around Baker City. According to Census Data and DHS data, 37% of the county's population, 44% of its poor, and 42% of its SNAP clients live in these areas (Northeast Baker City and Northwest Baker County census tracts).

The CCO is Eastern Oregon CCO (EOCCO). EOCCO oversees 12 counties in eastern Oregon and each county has a CAC. It is administered by Greater Oregon Behavioral Health, Inc. (GOBHI) and Moda Health. GOBHI provides behavioral healthcare services. Moda provides medical, pharmacy and chemical addiction treatment, care and services. EOCCO has a grant program whereby they provide funds to local CAC to implement projects. Medical customer service number is 503-765-3521.

Benton County Community Profile

Geographically, Benton County is Oregon's smallest county. The county seat is Corvallis. As of the 2010 Census, Benton County had 85,579 residents. The racial makeup of the county was:

- 87.1% white
- 5.2% Asian
- 0.9% black or African American
- 0.7% American Indian
- 0.2% Pacific islander
- 2.3% from other races
- 3.6% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 6.4% of the population.

About 7.7% of families and 19.1% of the population were below the poverty line (2010 Census). ORH estimated that in 2014 4.8% of residents were uninsured, 14.9% were enrolled in OHP, and 18.9% of residents lived in poverty.

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Benton County has two high poverty hotspots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 20% of the county's population, 26% of its poor, and 36% of its SNAP clients live in these areas.

1. North side of Corvallis extending into unincorporated areas along US Hwy 20 and the Willamette River.
2. Southwest portion of Corvallis extending south toward the airport.

General note: The presence of OSU impacts the socioeconomic characteristics of the county. On average, adult residents tend to be younger and more educated than in other counties.

Per statistics on Oregon.gov, 73 residents of Benton County had abortions during the period January 1 – November 1, 2017. In 2015, ORH estimated that Corvallis/Philomath had 10.7 FTE of OB/GYN. The entire southern half of Benton County, starting just south of Corvallis, is a medically-underserved population (ORH).

Clackamas County Community Profile

The county seat and largest city is Oregon City. As of the 2010 Census, Clackamas County had 375,992 residents making it Oregon's third most populous county. The racial makeup of the county was:

- 88.2% white
- 3.7% Asian
- 0.8% black or African American
- 0.8% American Indian
- 0.2% Pacific islander

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 7.7% of the population.

2. Central Milwaukie: includes downtown Milwaukie and extends north to Waverly Country Club and east to slightly beyond the Expressway.
3. Clackamas area: the unincorporated Clackamas area east of Gladstone city.

The hotspot is East Astoria and includes the eastern portion of the city and extends further east to include Tongue Point.

According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 46 residents had abortions from January – November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are 4.1 FTE of OB/GYN in Astoria and 2.0 in Seaside. Significant portions of the northeastern and southwestern corners of the county are considered medically-underserved areas. A very small portion of the northwestern corner is also medically-underserved.

Coos County is located in the southwest corner of Oregon. There are seven cities and the county seat is Coquille. As of the 2010 Census, Coos county has a population of 63,043 residents.

The racial makeup of the county was:

- 89.8% white
- 2.5% American Indian
- 1.0% Asian
- 0.4% black or African American
- 0.2% Pacific islander
- 1.7% from other races
- 4.3% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 5.4% of the population.

About 11.5% of families and 16.4% of the population were below the poverty line (2010 Census). ORH estimated that in 2014, 1.2% of residents were uninsured, 31.8% were enrolled in OHP, and 19.8% of residents lived in poverty.

Per statistics on Oregon.gov, 73 residents of Benton County had abortions during the period January 1 – November 1, 2017. In 2015, ORH estimated that Coso Bay had 4.2 FTE of OB/GYN, with Coquille/Myrtle Point and Bandon having 1.0 FTE each.

Coos County is considered a medically-underserved area (MUA). The national standard for physicians to population ratio is 1:631. In Coos County the ratio is 1:1,069. The most impacted cities are Coquille, Myrtle Point, and Powers.

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Coos County has three poverty hotspots with 28% of the county's population, 43% of its poor and 34% of SNAP clients in this one area. The three areas are:

1. The area south and west of Coos Bay/North Bend, extending down Cape Arago. It includes the communities of Charleston and Barview.
2. The west side of the city of Coos Bay with surrounding area to the south.
3. Southeastern portion of Coos County including the cities of Myrtle Point and Powers.

According to the Office of Rural Health, there are no OB/GYN in Powers, only 1.0 FTE in Bandon and Myrtle Point/Coquille and 4.2 FTE in Coos Bay. Oregon.gov statistics indicate that 42 county residents had abortions from January–November 1, 2017.

Per the 2013 Coos County Community Health Assessment, Coos County also provides a “large amount of health care to residents in north Curry County and Reedsport.” Regarding reproductive health services, Coos Health and Wellness, Public Health Division, Annual Report 2015 – 2016 states: “There is still a need for health care providers in the community. Our clinic also lacks funding to be able to provide and offer a wider range of birth control methods to those who can’t afford them, such as the patch and the implant, as these methods are more expensive.”

Curry County Community Profile

Medical care is primarily grouped in three cities: Gold Beach, Brookings, Port Orford. Gold Beach is the county seat. As of the 2010 Census, the population was 22,364.

The racial make-up of the county was:

- 92.0% white
- 1.9% American Indian
- 0.7% Asian
- 0.3% black or African American
- 0.1% Pacific islander
- 1.3% from other races
- 3.7% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 5.4% of the population. In 2014, The Pew Research Center determined that Latinos made up 7% of Curry county residents.

About 9.2% of families and 13.9% of the population were below the poverty line (2010 Census). ORH estimated that in 2014, 1.0% of residents were uninsured, 27.6% were enrolled in OHP, and 17.1% of residents lived in poverty. In 2017 OregonLive estimated that ~28% of residents are enrolled in OHP.

Oregon.gov statistics state that 18 County residents had abortions from January to November 1, 2017. In 2015, the ORH estimated that the Gold Beach area (central Curry County) had 1.5 FTE of OB/GYN, whereas Brookings and Port Orford had none. All of Curry County is considered to have a medically-underserved population.

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Curry County has one poverty hotspot with 16% of the county's population, 30% of its poor and 16% of SNAP clients in this one area. The hot spot is in northern Curry County including the city of Port Orford and the unincorporated community of Agness. Interestingly the Port Orford hotspot has a low percentage of females, children, and young adults compared to the state as a whole.

Veterans

One potentially vulnerable population to consider here is veterans, in particular female veterans. Curry Coastal Pilot reported in 2016 that Curry County had a registered 2,995 veterans although they believe that number is lower than veterans actually residing in the county. VA services in the area are limited and veterans are forced to travel (often to Roseburg – three hours away) in order to receive care. Female vets under age 35 are at high risk of

homelessness, suicide, and untreated symptoms of combat trauma and sexual assault. Female widows of veterans are also consumers of services offered by the VA.

- 0.9% American Indian
- 0.4% black or African American
- 0.1% Pacific islander
- 3.0% from other races,
- 2.5% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 7.4% of the population.

The 2010 Census estimated that 7.6% of families and 10.5% of the population were below the poverty line. In 2014, ORH estimated that 2.6% of residents were uninsured, 25% were enrolled in OHP, and 13.2% of residents lived in poverty.

Per statistics on Oregon.gov, 279 residents of Deschutes County had abortions during the period January 1 – November 1, 2017. In 2015, ORH estimated that Bend had 14.4 FTE of OB/GYN and Redmond had 4.9 FTE. The far southeastern corner (not quite the full southeastern quadrant) of Deschutes County is a medically-underserved population (ORH).

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Deschutes County has three poverty hotspots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 17% of the county population, 32% of the county poor, and 27% of SNAP clients live the three poverty hotspots.

1. Redmond south: South side of Redmond including the airport.
2. East Bend: East side of Bend surrounding Pilot Butte
3. La Pine: Southwestern Deschutes County including a portion of the city of La Pine, then down south to the Klamath County line and west to the Cascades crest.

Public Health Modernization Regional Partnership

In November 2017, ORH awarded \$3.6 million dollars statewide to different regional partnerships to work on specific Public Health Modernization goals.

Grantee: Deschutes, Crook, and Jefferson Counties; St. Charles Health System, Central Oregon Health Council.

Project: Form the Central Oregon Outbreak Prevention, Surveillance and Response Team which will improve:

- communicable disease outbreak coordination, prevention and response in the region;

Funds will be directed to communicable disease prevention and control among vulnerable older adults living in institutional settings and young children receiving care in child care centers with high exemption rates.

3. Winston-Dillard area: South of Roseburg along the South Umpqua River and west of I-5. It includes the city of Winston and the unincorporated area of Dillard.
4. South Douglas County: Southern Douglas County along I-5 and the South Umpqua River. It includes Riddle and Canyonville, and the portion of Myrtle Creek, as well as the unincorporated Tri-City area.

- 88.7% white
- 1.2% Asian
- 1.2% American Indian
- 0.7% black or African American
- 0.3% Pacific islander
- 4.5% from other races
- 3.5% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 10.7% of the population. A 2016 CHA by Providence Health System, predicts that by 2021 Jackson county will be 75% white/non-Hispanic, but with 18% growth in the Hispanic/Latino population.

- The hotspots of White City, Phoenix, and the rural southwest portion of the county (including unincorporated communities of Foothills Creek, Applegate, and Ruch) contain 7% of the county's population, 9% of its poor and 8% of SNAP clients in this one area.
- Three hotspots in Medford contain 14% of the county's population, 23% of its poor, and 26% of the SNAP clients. The three areas are:
 1. A portion of Medford that lies west of I-5 and extends west of the outskirts of Jacksonville. It includes portions of Liberty Park, Washington and McLoughlin neighborhoods.

- 3.8% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 19.3% of the population.

From 2000 to 2007, Jefferson County's population grew by 15.9%, more than twice the national average. It was the third fastest growing county in the state, after neighboring Deschutes and Crook counties (Wikipedia).

About 13.5% of families and 20.1% of the population were below the poverty line. For 2014, ORH estimated that 4.6% of the county is uninsured, 36.2% are enrolled in OHP (the number one highest enrollment in the state), and 21.2% of the population lived in poverty.

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Jefferson County has three poverty hotspots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 53% of the county population, 73% of the county poor, and 63% of SNAP clients live in the three poverty hotspots. The hotspots are:

1. Madras West: the western portion of Madras
2. Metholius/Culver: Most of the southwest portion of Jefferson County including Metolius, Culver, and the Camp Sherman community. (It excludes a section of land between the Crooked and Deschutes Rivers between Deschutes County and Cove Palisades State Park.)
3. Warm Springs: The southern section of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Spring Reservation.
 - a. Note: Among ALL Oregon hot spots, Warm Springs:
 - Highest percentage of households headed by single mothers
 - Third highest per capita number of SNAP receipt

- Highest rate of TANF receipt
- Second highest rate of participation in alcohol and drug programs.

According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 29 residents had abortions from January – November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are zero FTE of OB/GYN in Jefferson County. All of Jefferson County is considered to have a medically-underserved population.

Public Health Modernization Regional Partnership

Josephine County Community Scan

Josephine County has two cities: Grants Pass and Cave Junction. The county seat of Grants Pass has ~35,000 residents (42% of total), while most county residents (total population 82,713) live in over 24 unincorporated areas with geographic barriers to accessing medical care.

- 1.4% American Indian
- 0.8% Asian
- 0.4% black or African American
- 0.2% Pacific islander
- 1.5% from other races,
- 3.2% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 6.3% of the population.

About 13.5% of families and 17.8% of the population were below the poverty line (2010 Census). ORH estimated that in 2014, 1.0% of residents were uninsured, 36.1% were enrolled in OHP (one of the higher enrollments in Oregon) and 20.6% of residents lived in poverty.

According to statistics found at Oregon.gov, 91 county residents had abortions from January to November 1, 2017. ORH estimates that Cave Junction has zero FTE of OB/GYN whereas Grants Pass has 6.2 FTE. Nearly all of Josephine County is considered a medically underserved area.

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Josephine County has three poverty hotspots with 15% of the county's population, 21% of its poor and 19% of SNAP clients in this one area. The three areas are:

1. Northernmost portion of Josephine County including the unincorporated area of Wolf Creek.
2. Southernmost portion of Josephine County including Cave Junction and the communities of Kerby, O'Brien, and a portion of Williams.
3. Central Josephine County extending from just west of Grants Pass and to the Curry County Line, including the Wilderville community.

Grants Pass has two additional poverty hotspots. Within these two hotspots lives 21% of the county's population, 28% of its poor, and 27% of its SNAP clients. The two areas are:

1. Grants Pass north central: a portion of Grants Pass that lies north of the Rogue River.
2. South Grants Pass: a portion of the city that lies south of the Rogue River.

Josephine County falls within the contract service area of one Tribal organization.

This area is sometimes referred to as Oregon's Outback. It is sparsely populated (~1 person per square mile), isolated, and has high rates of poverty. Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies Poverty Hot Spots as geographic concentrations of poor residents. As of 2015, Lake County has only "one" hotspot, but it covers nearly the entire county, minus only the southwestern corner where the town of Lakeview is situated.

The northern half of Lake County was one of three areas in the state to receive the worst ranking by the Office of Rural Health in terms of unmet need in 2017.  - b. Glenwood: A portion of south Eugene, the unincorporated area of Glenwood, and the area around Lane Community College.
2. West/Central Eugene has three poverty hotspots: Eight percent of Lane County's population, 12% of its poor, and 13% of its SNAP clients live in this area.
 - a. Bethel Area: West Eugene including a portion of the Bethel neighborhood and extending to the edge of the airport.

 - b. Gateway: The Gateway area within Springfield and unincorporated land north of the city along the McKenzie River.
 - c. West Springfield: The western edge of the city.
 - d. Willamalane Park: The Willamalane area of Springfield.
4. Cottage Grove. There is one hotspot which includes 1% of the Lane County population, 2% of its poor, and 2% of its SNAP clients.
 - a. Southeast Cottage Grove: South central Lane County including the southeast portion of the city of Cottage Grove and extending southeast past Cottage Grove Lake.
5. Junction City: One poverty hotspot was identified and includes 1% each of the county population, the county poor, and SNAP clients.
 - a. Junction City area: an area along the west side of the Willamette River from Eugene Airport to the Linn County Line and encompassing a portion of Junction City.
6. Mapleton: There is one hotspot which includes 1% respectively of the county's population, the county's poor, and its SNAP clients.

In 2015, ORH estimated that Florence had 2.6 FTE of OB/GYN, while Eugene West had 4.2 FTE, Eugene/University area had 18.3 FTE, and Springfield had 8.1 FTE. Only a relatively small corner of SE Lane County is considered to be a medically-underserved area (ORH).

Lincoln County Community Profile

The county seat is Newport. As of the 2010 census, the population was 46,034. The racial make-up of the county was:

- 87.7% white
- 3.5% American Indian
- 0.4% black or African American
- 1.1% Asian
- 0.1% Pacific islander
- 3.4% from other races
- 3.7% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 7.9% of the population.

About 11.7% of families and 16.2% of the population were below the poverty line. For 2014, ORH estimated that 3.8% of the county is uninsured, 29.9% are enrolled in OHP, and 18.8% of the population lived in poverty (Oregon state rate is 16.4%).

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Lincoln County has one high poverty hotspot. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 4% of the county population, 6% of the county poor, and 6% of SNAP clients live in the poverty hotspot. The hotspot is the Nye Beach area of Newport City.

According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 49 residents had abortions from January – November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are 1.9 FTE of OB/GYN in Lincoln City, and 3.3 FTE in Newport. There are two areas of Lincoln County considered to have medically-underserved populations: 1) the western coast (down to around Depoe Bay) and extending diagonally northeast toward the county border; and 2) a large portion of the eastern county from Logsdon (in the north) to as far south as Tidewater. The southern portion of the county (south of Tidewater) is considered a medically-underserved area.

Lincoln County, as part of a coalition, is a 2017-2019 Public Health Modernization Grantee. The coalition also includes Benton, Linn, and Lane Counties and Oregon State University. Coalition goals are:

1. Establish a learning laboratory to facilitate cross-county information exchange and continuous learning.

2. Implement an evidence-based quality improvement program (AFIX) to increase immunization rates.
3. Pilot three local vaccination projects: 1) Hepatitis A vaccination among unhoused people in Linn and Benton Counties; 2) HPV vaccination among adolescents attending school-based health centers in Lincoln County; and 3) pneumococcal vaccination among hospital discharge patients in Lane County.
4. Establish an Academic Health Department model with Oregon State University to extend public health capacity and support evaluation.

Lincoln County is also a member of CHIRP Community Partners (Community Health Implementation and Research Partnership) out of the Oregon Office of Rural Health. Lincoln County implemented a CHIP (Community Health Improvement Partnership) in 2002. The following priorities have been identified: children's health, school-based health centers, chronic disease management, access to care, health community promotion, and access/referral to health services.

Linn County Community Profile

The county seat is Albany. As of the 2010 census, the population was 116,672. The racial make-up of the county was:

- 90.6% white
- 1.3% American Indian
- 0.5% black or African American
- 1.0% Asian
- 0.1% Pacific islander
- 3.3% from other races
- 3.3% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 7.8% of the population.

About 11.0% of families and 15.6% of the population were below the poverty line. For 2014, ORH estimated that 2.1% of the county is uninsured, 29.4% are enrolled in OHP, and 19.1% of the population lived in poverty (Oregon state rate is 16.4%).

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Linn County has five high poverty hotspots. Three of the hotspots are grouped together since they are in or near the city of Albany, with others located in Sweet Home and Lebanon.

1. The south side of the city of Lebanon
2. The northwest portion of the Sweet Home and extending into unincorporated Linn County
 - a. Census Bureau and DHS data show that 11% of the county population, 15% of the county poor, and 14% of SNAP clients live in these two hot spots.
3. A portion of Albany that includes downtown and extends east to Waverly Lake
4. A portion of Albany that lies south of Pacific Boulevard and is centered at the intersections of Queen Avenue SE and Geary Street SE. (Interesting note: This area has the third highest percentage of single mother households among all Oregon hotspots.)
5. The south side of Albany, north of Linn Benton Community College
 1. Census Bureau and DHS data indicate that 20% of the county population, 34% of the county poor, and 27% of SNAP clients live in these Albany hot spots.

According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 116 residents had abortions from January – November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are 4.3 FTE of OB/GYN in Albany, and 3.6 FTE in Lebanon. There is

one area of Linn County in and around the city of Sweet Home that is considered to have a medically-underserved population.

Linn County, as part of a coalition, is a 2017-2019 Public Health Modernization Grantee. The coalition also includes Benton, Lincoln, and Lane Counties and Oregon State University.

Coalition goals are:

1. Establish a learning laboratory to facilitate cross-county information exchange and continuous learning.
2. Implement an evidence-based quality improvement program (AFIX) to increase immunization rates.
3. Pilot three local vaccination projects: 1) Hepatitis A vaccination among unhoused people in Linn and Benton Counties; 2) HPV vaccination among adolescents attending school-based health centers in Lincoln County; and 3) pneumococcal vaccination among hospital discharge patients in Lane County.
4. Establish an Academic Health Department model with Oregon State University to extend public health capacity and support evaluation.

Linn County is also a member of CHIRP Community Partners (Community Health Implementation and Research Partnership) out of the Oregon Office of Rural Health. Linn County implemented a CHIP (Community Health Improvement Partnership) in 2002. Check The following priorities have been identified: children's health, school-based health centers, chronic disease management, access to care, health community promotion, and access/referral to health services.

Malheur County Community Profile

Malheur County is in the southeast corner of Oregon. As of 2010, it had 31,313 residents. The county seat is Vale. “By definition, Malheur County is considered “frontier” with a mere 3.2 persons per square mile – although the population is fairly clustered together in small communities. Geographic isolation results in challenges accessing Oregon services. While Idaho is in close proximity, residents of Malheur County are often unable to utilize government services across state lines.” (St. Alphonsus CHA 2014)

Based on 2010 Census data, the racial makeup of the county was:

- 77.5% white
- 1.7% Asian
- 1.2% American Indian
- 1.2% black or African American
- 0.1% Pacific islander
- 15.5% from other races
- 2.9% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 31.5% of the population (one of the highest rates in the state).

In 2014 ORH estimated that 7% of the population was uninsured, 34.4% were in enrolled in OHP (one of the highest enrollments in the state), and 28.7% lived in poverty. This high rate of poverty makes Malheur County the poorest county in Oregon.

ORH statistics for 2015 state there were only 5.2 FTE of OB/GYN in Malheur County, centralized around the city of Ontario. According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 8 residents of Malheur County had abortions from January to November 1, 2017. Southern Malheur County is considered a medically-underserved area.

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies Poverty Hot Spots as geographic concentrations of poor residents. As of 2015, Malheur County has three poverty hotspots. Two are located in Ontario and the other in Vale. These areas include 44% of Malheur County’s population, 59% of its poor, and 60% of its SNAP clients. The three areas are:

1. A portion of the southwest side of the city of Ontario and extending to the southwest limits of the city.
2. A portion of the eastern part of the city of Ontario.

3. Encompassing the city of Vale and extending out into unincorporated areas of Malheur County.

Of all Oregon hotspots, Ontario East has multiple indicators (e.g. highest poverty rate, 4th lowest high school completion rate, etc.) which when combined result in a 3rd place ranking on the hotspot indices.

CCO is Eastern Oregon CCO (EOCCO). Overseas 12 counties in eastern Oregon and each county has a CAC. It is administered by Greater Oregon Behavioral Health, Inc. (GOBHI) and Moda Health. GOBHI provides behavioral healthcare services. Moda provides medical, pharmacy and chemical additional treatment, care and services. ECCO has a grant program whereby the provide funds to local CAC to implement projects.

About 11.7% of families and 16% of the population were below the poverty line. For 2014, ORH estimated that 9% of the county is uninsured, 29% are enrolled in OHP, and 17.7% of the population lived in poverty (Oregon state rate is 16.4%).

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Marion County had 11 poverty hotspots. There are four hotspots in outer Salem, three hotspots in inner northeast Salem, and four in the Woodburn/Gervais area.

1. Outer Salem Hot Spots: According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 15% of the county's population, 23% of its poor, and 23% of SNAP clients live in the four hotspots.
 - a. Hayesville: the unincorporated area of Hayesville on Salem's northeast side. It encompasses Chemeketa Community College.
 - b. North/East Lancaster: Portions of Salem's North East, North Lancaster, and East Lancaster neighborhoods.
 - c. Four Corners/SE Mill Creek Area: East Salem including portions of the unincorporated Four Corners area, the Southeast Mill Creek neighborhood, and Marion County's East Salem Suburban Neighborhood Association.
 - d. Salem Airport: An area surrounding the Salem Airport and including parts of the Southeast Salem, Morningside, and Southeast Mill Creek Neighborhoods.
 - All four areas have relatively low educational attainment compared to other Oregon hotspots. Hayesville had the tenth highest percentage

of adults without high school diploma or GED. The Airport area, Four Corners, and Lancaster ranked 12th, 13th and 14th respectively.

- Of all Oregon hotspots, Hayesville had the second highest percentage of single mother households and the 9th highest poverty rate.
 - The Airport ranks fourth overall on the hotspot index due to high program participation (e.g., SNAP, child welfare, etc.), high geographic mobility, low educational attainment and high poverty rates.
 - More than 1/3 of Hayesville residents, 25% of NE Lancaster residents, and 23 % of Four Corners residents had a non-English language preference. The most common non-English languages were Russian and Spanish.
2. Inner Northeast Salem Hot Spots: According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 6% of the County's population, 12% of its poor, and 12% of SNAP clients live in the three hotspots.
- a. Grant/Highland: A portion of the city of Salem that encompasses Grant and Highland neighborhoods, the south end of the city of Keizer, and the NE Salem industrial area.
 - b. Englewood: A section of Salem centered around 17th and Markets Streets NE. It includes a portion of the Northeast Neighbors neighborhood.
 - c. Northgate: A triangular area in NE Salem that encompasses a part of the Northgate neighborhood. It is bounded by the Union Pacific Railroad tracks on the north, I-5 on the East, and Silverton Road on the South.
 - Among all Oregon hotspots, Northgate had the second highest poverty rate, 7th highest percent of adults without high school diplomas or GED, and 8th highest percentage of single mother households.
 - Due to high poverty rates, high percentage of single mother households, low educational attainment and high program involvement (e.g., child welfare), the Grant/Highland and Northgate hotspots rank 6th and 8th on the overall hotspot index.
 - Thirty percent of residents in the Northgate area had a non-English language preference, and out of that 90% preferred Spanish.
3. Woodburn and Gervais Hot Spots: According to Census Bureau and DHS Data, 8% of Marion County's population, 12% of its poor, and 9% of its SNAP clients live in the four hotspots.

- a. Woodburn Northeast: The northeast portion of Woodburn and extending east to the unincorporated area of Marion County.
- b. Woodburn Southeast: The southeast portion of Woodburn.
- c. Woodburn West: The western portion of Woodburn.
- d. Gervais: The city of Gervais, south of Woodburn and the surrounding area.
 - Adult residents in Woodburn Southeast had the lowest rate of high school completion and the lowest rate of English language preference among all Oregon hotspots. Woodburn West was second lowest for English language preference, Woodburn Northeast was 4th, and Gervais was 6th. Spanish was the most preferred non-English language.

According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 432 residents had abortions from January – November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are 22.7 FTE of OB/GYN south of Salem, 2.0 FTE north of Salem, and 1.0 FTE in Stayton. The northernmost section of Marion County is considered to be medically underserved. Interestingly, a glance at the map shows that this medically underserved area does not include the Salem poverty hotspots, although it does include Woodburn.

Marion County, with Polk County and Willamette Valley Community Health CCO, as partners, is a 2017-2019 Public Health Modernization Grantee. The goal of the partnership is to decrease the spread of gonorrhea and chlamydia and increase HPV immunization rates.

Morrow County Community Providers

The county seat is Heppner. As of the 2010 Census, Morrow County had 11,173 residents. The racial makeup of the county was:

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 31.3% of the population (one of the top five counties for Latinos in Oregon).

ORH indicates that in 2015 there were no full-time OB/GYN in Morrow County. They estimate there are 0.9 FTE Primary Care MD or PA in Irrigon, 3.5 FTE in Boardman and 2.5 FTE in Heppner. The northern quarter of Morrow County is considered to a medically-underserved area.

In 2014, ORH estimated that 9.1% of the county was uninsured, 27.5% were enrolled in OHP, and 16.3% live in poverty.

CCO is Eastern Oregon CCO (EOCCO). EOCCO oversees 12 counties in eastern Oregon and each county has a CAC. It is administered by Greater Oregon Behavioral Health, Inc. (GOBHI) and Moda Health. GOBHI provides behavioral healthcare services. Moda provides medical, pharmacy and chemical addiction treatment, care and services. EOCCO has a grant program whereby they provide funds to local CAC to implement projects.

Multnomah County Community Profile

The county seat and largest city is Portland. As of the 2010 Census, Washington County had 735,334 residents. It is the most populous county in Oregon. The racial makeup of the county was:

- 76.5% white
- 6.5% Asian
- 5.6% black or African American
- 1.1% American Indian
- 0.5% Pacific islander
- 5.1% from other races
- 4.6% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 10.9% of the population.

About 11.3% of families and 16.0% of the population were below the poverty line (2010 Census). ORH estimated that in 2014 8.7% of residents were uninsured, XXXXX were enrolled in OHP, and 18.6% of residents lived in poverty (Oregon rate is 16.4%).

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Multnomah County has six areas with multiple high poverty hotspots in each one.

1. East Portland contains four poverty hot spots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 10% of the county's population, 18% of SNAP clients and 17% of the county's poor live in this these four poverty hotspots.
 - a. Centennial area: portions of the Centennial, Glenfair and Wilkes neighborhoods in East Portland
 - Among all Oregon hotspots, this area ranked second in terms of concurrent TANF participation and domestic violence program participation, fourth in child welfare involvement, and 21st in mental health program participation. These measures, along with a relatively high percentage of single-mother households and low rate of high school completion, caused this area to have a hotspot index rank of 1.
 - b. Lents/Powellhurst -Gilbert: portions of the Lents and Powellhurst-Gilbert neighborhoods in SE Portland.

- c. Mill Park-Hazelwood area: portions of the Mill Park and Hazelwood neighborhoods in SE Portland.
- d. Argay-Wilkes: portions of the Argay and Wilkes neighborhoods in NE Portland.
 - This poverty hotspot had the highest percentage of domestic violence program participation of all Oregon hotspots.

Notes: Among all Oregon hotspots, in terms of percentage of clients with non-English language preference, these poverty hotspots had the following rankings: 9th – Mill Park; 16th – Lents; 24th – Argay; and 25th – Centennial. While there were many language preferences among East Portland residents, the most common were Spanish, Russian, Vietnamese, Cantonese, Burmese, Somali, and Arabic.

2. Central Portland: Central Portland has three high poverty hotspots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 2% of the county's population, 3% of SNAP clients and 3% of the county's poor live in these areas.
 - a. Pearl/China Town: northwest Portland including portions of the Pearl and Old Town/China Town.
 - b. Northwest District: A portion of Portland's Northwest District neighborhood.
 - c. Goose Hollow: A portion of southwest Portland's Goose Hollow neighborhood.
3. Gresham Area: contains four poverty hot spots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 8% of the county's population, 13% of SNAP clients and 13% of the county's poor live in this these four poverty hotspots.
 - a. Northeast Halsey: portions of the Wilkes East, North Gresham, and Rockwood neighborhoods in the city of Gresham.
 - b. Rockwood-Centennial: portions of the Centennial, Rockwood, and Northwest neighborhoods of the city of Gresham.
 - c. Central City: Central City neighborhood and a portion of the Northwest neighborhood.
 - d. Reynolds area: Gresham's North Central and Northeast neighborhoods, the southeast corner of Fairview, Wood Village south of 1-84, and the southwest portion of Troutdale.

Note: The Northeast Halsey area had the 10th lowest rate of English-language preference, with Rockwood and Central City ranked 15th and 20th lowest respectively. While there were many language preferences, the most common were Spanish, Russian, Somali, Arabic, Burmese, and Vietnamese.

4. North and Inner-Northeast Portland: contains four poverty hot spots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 4% of the county's population, 6% of SNAP clients and 7% of the county's poor live in this these four poverty hotspots.
 - a. Alberta and MLK: Portions of Humboldt, King, and Vernon neighborhoods and centered at the intersection of NE Alberta Street and NE MLK Jr. Blvd.
 - b. Arbor Lodge/Piedmont: sections of Piedmont and Arbor Lodge neighborhoods.
 - c. Lloyd/Elliot: Encompassing the Lloyd District, Eliot neighborhood, and portions of the Irvington and Boise neighborhoods.
 - d. St. John's/Portsmouth: portions of St. Johns and Portsmouth neighborhoods.

5. Portland Airport area: contains two high poverty hot spots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 3% of the county's population, 3% of SNAP clients and 4% of the county's poor live in this these two poverty hotspots.
 - a. Cully area: most of the Cully neighborhood
 - b. Sumner/Madison South: includes most of the Sumner and Madison neighborhoods.

6. Inner Southeast Portland: contains three high poverty hot spots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 3% of the county's population, 3% of SNAP clients and 5% of the county's poor live in this these two poverty hotspots.
 - a. Buckman/Kerns: Sections of the Buckman and Kerns neighborhood.
 - b. Powell Park: portions of the Hosford-Abernathy, Richmond, Brooklyn, and Creston-Kenilworth neighborhoods and centered around Powell Park
 - c. North Tabor: the North Tabor neighborhood.

Per statistics on Oregon.gov, 1,975 residents of Multnomah County had abortions during the period January 1 – November 1, 2017. In 2015, ORH estimated that county has roughly 80 FTE of OB/GYN, with nearly 43 FTE being concentrated in Portland. A very small sliver of the west county is considered to be a medically-underserved area.

Polk County Community Profile

The county seat is Dallas. As of the 2010 census, the population was 75,043. The racial make-up of the county was:

- 85.9% white
- 2.1% American Indian
- 0.6% black or African American
- 1.9% Asian
- 0.3% Pacific islander
- 5.4% from other races
- 3.8% from two or more races.

Those of Hispanic or Latino origin made up 12.1% of the population.

About 8.8% of families and 12.9% of the population were below the poverty line. For 2014, ORH estimated that 5% of the county was uninsured, 23.4% were enrolled in OHP, and 14.1% of the population lived in poverty (Oregon state rate is 16.4%).

Oregon DHS Office of Forecasting, Research, and Analysis identifies poverty hotspots as contiguous census tracts with poverty rates of 20% or more for two or more pre-determined measurements. Polk County has two high poverty hotspots.

1. Most of the area of West Salem that lies below the Eola Hills (West Salem is a neighborhood of Salem that lies in Polk County. The rest of the city of Salem is in Marion County.)
2. Most of Independence city and extending south into rural Polk County.

It is interesting to note that among all Oregon poverty hot spots that West Salem has the 6th highest poverty rate and the 6th highest percentage of adults without a high school diploma or GED.

According to statistics on Oregon.gov, 64 residents had abortions from January – November 1, 2017. ORH estimates there are zero FTE of OB/GYN in Polk County. A portion of the northwest corner of the County is considered a medically-underserved area (includes Grande Ronde and Valley Junction). The area of the County just right of center, from the northern border to southern border, approximately following the road 99W, is considered to hold a medically-underserved population (this area is included in the poverty hotspot which incorporates the city of Independence and extends southward).

Polk County, with Marion County and Willamette Valley Community Health CCO, as partners, is a 2017-2019 OHA Public Health Modernization Grantee. The group has two goals: 1) Focus on system coordination and disease- and population-specific interventions to control the spread of gonorrhea and chlamydia; and 2) to increase HPV immunization rates among adolescents.

Yamhill County has two high poverty hotspots. According to Census Bureau and DHS data, 14% of the county's population, 26% of its poor, and 19% of its SNAP clients live in the two poverty hotspots.

1. McMinnville South: the southwest portion of McMinnville and extending south into unincorporated Yamhill County.
2. Newberg South: The south side of the Newberg city and extending south into unincorporated Yamhill County.

Per statistics on Oregon.gov, 115 residents of Yamhill County had abortions during the period January 1 – November 1, 2017. In 2015, ORH estimated that McMinnville has 3.6 FTE of OB/GYN and Newberg has 4.7 FTE. The southeastern (rectangle-shaped) section of the county is a medically underserved area.
