OPHAT- the Oregon Public Health Assessment Tool is a web-based data query system and analytical tool developed primarily for the Oregon public health system. OPHAT allows users to access, analyze and display data from a number of public health databases. OPHAT was developed for the purpose of supporting public health assessment and related functions at the state and local level.

Many, but not all data sources can drill down to the county level.

Data includes (this is just a sample):

- Vital statistics (births, deaths, pregnancy and abortion)
- Birth risk factors (from birth certificates)
- Population estimates (includes age, race/ethnicity)
- BRFSS survey data, which includes access to health care and health coverage and many other health-related topics! This also have contraceptive use data but at the state level only.
