





Examples of where and how this promotion might happen are at places like schools, or activities such as tabling at health fairs etc.






History of PE 46

- PE 46, entitled <u>'Community Participation and Assurance of Access</u>
 <u>to Reproductive Health Services'</u> was developed in collaboration
 with members of the Conference of Local Health Officials (CLHO)
 and approved in February 2018.
- The funding for PE 46 comes from the RH Program's Title X grant and is based on a new formula that incorporates many factors, including: county population, non-white population, limited English proficiency, urban/rural, Chlamydia rates, and Women in Need.




