Many patients understandably fear potential enforcement actions at their local health centers, leading to delays or avoidance of accessing essential health care, like family planning and sexual health services.

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## NEW: Language Access Workbook for Providers

**Increasing Language Access in Oregon: A Workbook for Providers** is designed to help health care organizations, providers and care teams understand Oregon's language access requirements and take practical steps to ensure patients receive care they understand. It highlights strategies to:

- Meet federal and state standards,
- Improve performance on the Meaningful Language Access (Health Equity) measure, and
- Strengthen trust and communication with patients who communicate in a language other than English or who use sign language.
