Reminder: National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) Requirements

This is your periodic reminder that clients completing the RHAF Enrollment Form at RHCare and CCare clinics must be offered the opportunity to register to vote.

If a client marks 'Yes' to the question "Do you want to register to vote today?", you must provide the client with the <u>Voter Registration Card with Declination (SEL 503)</u>. The client may take the form home to complete and mail to the elections office or request help in completing and mailing the form. To help clients, follow the procedure described in the <u>National Voter Registration Act Manual for Covered Agencies</u>.

Please remember that clinics must report the number of voter registration forms mailed to a county elections office each month, even if no cards were mailed. The reports are due the 15th of each month. The online version is linked below. Be sure to include your NVRA Agency ID number. If you don't know your Agency ID, please call the Elections Division at 503-986-1518.

Agency Voter Registration Reporting (SEL 504)

Fee-for-Service reimbursement for health care interpreter services, effective July 1, 2025

As of July 1, 2025, all fee-for-service (FFS) providers can bill up to \$67.35 per member per day for providing health care interpreter services to open card (FFS) members. OHA will pay this cost for encounters that meet the criteria outlined in the updated updated include:

- Listing providers not eligible for the add-on fee (based on the interpreter services rule)
- Providers can now bill the add-on fee for visits not using an interpreter on the OHA
 Health Care Interpreter Registry as long as the provider documents that they made
 a "Good Faith Effort" to find an interpreter using the registry, and were unable to
 find one

As a reminder, providers can submit FFS claims to OHA for up to one year from the original date of service. This may be especially helpful for providers who have paid for interpreter services in the past but haven't yet billed OHA for the add-on fee.
