

OHP FFS rate increases for family planning visits and vasectomies effective July 1, 2026

Effective July 1, 2026, OHA is increasing the OHP fee-for-service rates for two family planning-related codes:

- The rate for HCPCS code T1015 (Clinic visit/encounter, all-inclusive; family planning) will increase from \$185 to \$230. Use of this code is limited to enrolled family planning clinics as outlined in [Oregon Administrative Rule 410-130-0587](#).
- The rate for CPT code 55250 (Vasectomy, removal of sperm duct(s)) will increase to \$500 for both the facility and non-facility rate.
