

Program Changes Starting Sept. 1, 2026

For both RHCare and CCare Clinics

- Bundled reimbursement rates will be increasing by about 24%. Starting 9/1/2026, the new rates will be:
 - Low: \$98
 - Moderate: \$252
 - High: \$396
- Reimbursement for Chlamydia/gonorrhea testing will be weighted to account for multiple specimens. The new rate for CT/GC testing will be: \$67.39.
- Reimbursement for pain management services (nitrous oxide, moderate sedation, and deep sedation) will be available. You will be able to select new medical services that, if marked on the CVR, will add reimbursement on top of the bundled rates.

For RHCare Clinics

- Primary ICD-10 codes for STI screening and counseling will be covered for all enrollees (currently these are only covered for specific population of enrollees assigned female sex at birth, live in Oregon, and have “Another Status”).
- Primary ICD-10 codes for well visits will require a secondary family planning diagnosis code for all enrollees. Currently, enrollees with clients assigned female sex at birth, live in Oregon, and have “Another Status” have coverage for well visits without any secondary diagnosis code requirements, but we rarely see claims without secondary family planning codes. This change makes RHAF coverage for well visits consistent for all enrollees.

For CCare Clinics

- New coverage for primary ICD-10 codes for STI treatment and rescreening as well as coverage for STI treatment medications (these are already covered for RHCare clinics). Clients who received an STI screening as part of a RHAF visit and tested positive will now have coverage for treatment and rescreening visits. This coverage includes treatment and rescreening for Chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis, and trichomoniasis.
