

Webinar: Data Privacy, Immigration, and Public Charge

Over the past year, the RH Program has received questions and heard concerns about immigration and data privacy due to the expansion of reproductive health coverage to include more immigrant populations, and recent proposed changes to the federal public charge rule. To address these questions and concerns, the RH Program will host a webinar to:

- describe how information collected on the RH Program Enrollment form is used and/or shared with others;
- provide key talking points for clinic staff working with immigrant clients; and
- answer questions related to data privacy and public charge.

Supply Purchasing News

The Supply Reimbursement Rate Chart for Q2, effective April 1, 2019 is online. Several of the 340B reimbursement rates have increased slightly, and the maximum rate for the Caya diaphragm has increased to \$102 to reflect the current cost. Note: there is no 340B rate for Caya as it is not a medication.

The 340B Prime Vendor Program has even lower prices on EC, Depo, Liletta and Nexplanon, so please consider joining if you are eligible and not already a member.

Also of note, the definition of a unit of Azithromycin has changed to a one gram dose rather than a tablet, as tablets can come in smaller amounts to equal a dose. If you have supply purchasing questions, please contact Karol Almroth at

Webinar: Intimate Partner Violence and Reproductive Coercion Impacts on Access and Use

(Thursday, May 2, 8:00-9:00)

Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) also known as domestic violence is common. One in three Oregonian women will experience IPV in their lifetime compared to national average of 1 in 4, and women ages 18-34 experience the highest rates of violence. In this webinar we'll discuss the intersections of reproductive health and intimate partner violence, particularly as it relates to reproductive coercion; introduce an evidence-based screening and referral tool along with clinic practices that support patients experiencing abuse; and review community-based advocacy organizations as a resource and ally for your patients and clinics.

Patient-Centered Counseling Trainings

(no-cost CMEs available)

Dana Sturtevant, MS, RD, will lead a full-day, CME-accredited training focused on learning and practicing patient-centered counseling skills. The session will focus on increasing your confidence and skills to facilitate conversations with patients about sensitive topics. Examples will draw from effective contraceptive use and sexual health, tobacco use, controlling high blood pressure and other CCO metric-related topics. Evidence-based health communication models will include motivational interviewing, the FRAMES model and Five A's for tobacco cessation counseling.
