Eligibility Database Reminder: Check for Existing Enrollment Records Before Adding a New Record!

When seeing clients who qualify for RH Program Coverage, please make sure to **search for each client before adding a new record in the eligibility database**. We want to avoid creating duplicate records for clients! You can search by first and last name, or just last name, or first name + DOB, or SSN. You can even search using just the first few letters of the first and/or last names if you're not sure of spelling.

You can update an old enrollment record whether the client's eligibility ended years ago or just recently (for example if they had OHP, or had their eligibility ended because of an income discrepancy, or if their last enrollment period expired). Just change the "Date client signed enrollment form" and any other information that has changed. You might also find that a client has enrolled at another clinic and they currently have RH Program Coverage – if so, you can just bill the RH Program for their visit and the client does not have to complete a new form.

We appreciate your help in preventing duplicate records! If you find a client with duplicate records, please contact Sara (sara.n.botelho@dhsosha.state.or.us) so we can delete one of them.
