Clinical Guide for Trauma Informed Care

All RHCare, CCare, and AbortionCare clinics are required to provide services using a trauma-informed approach. This job aid, created by the National Clinical Training Center for Family Planning (NCTCFP), defines trauma-informed care (TIC) and offers a roadmap to providing TIC before, during, and after a physical exam in sexual and reproductive health settings with action steps and sample phrases. It also includes a self-assessment checklist at the end.

New Resources on the Updated Public Charge Rule

In September, the US Citizenship and Immigration Services published its final rule on public charge which will become effective on December 23, 2022. The final public charge rule is largely similar to the pre-Trump administration rule, with a few minor helpful clarifications. The key messages to share regarding the public charge rule are: 1) Public charge does not apply to most immigrants – many immigrants are exempt from the public charge test, and 2) Most government programs do not count as part of the public charge assessment. The non-profit, Protecting Immigrant Families, has developed a number of helpful resources and fact sheets, available in multiple languages, about the new public charge rule for communities and service providers.

Reviewer's Corner

Reminders

Here are a few reminders based on patterns we're seeing during desk reviews:

- Enrollment forms must be signed and dated. This date should match the eligibility database.
- Re-enrollments also require an enrollment form to be completed.
- Don't forget to ensure the client completes the entire form, even if you already have some of that information. That includes key questions like ability to get pregnant or get someone else pregnant, immigration/citizenship status, and tax filings and income.
- Information on the enrollment form should match the information you enter in the eligibility database. If there are discrepancies, use the Notes boxes in the database to explain those differences.
- When conducting remote enrollments, staff need to complete an enrollment form on behalf of the client and save it in the client folder. Do not enter information directly into the database. See our [Remote Enrollment Guidance](#) ↗
- Don't forget to bill the RH Program for supplies, language assistance, and CT/GC screening.
