RH Access Fund Clients' Enrollment Extended to 24 Months Starting June 1st

Starting June 1st, all clients enrolled in the RH Access Fund (RHAF) will have their eligibility extended by one year and anyone who enrolls on or after June 1st will be granted 24-months of eligibility! This means:

- Clients will only need to complete the enrollment form once every two years!
- Staff will only need to enter clients' information in the Eligibility Database every two years!
- Eligibility verification processes will only happen every two years!

Our hope is that this reduces burden on both staff and clients, and increases access. Resources and tools will be updated to reflect this change closer to the go-live date (June 1st).

New HHS Rule to Support Reproductive Health Care Privacy

The Office for Civil Rights (OCR) at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) recently announced a final rule titled "HIPAA Privacy Rule to Support Reproductive Health Care Privacy".

The rule will prevent providers and insurers from providing health care information to state officials investigating or prosecuting anyone seeking or providing a legal abortion. It also requires covered entities to receive signed attestations, with requests for PHI related to reproductive health care, that the use or disclosure will not be used for those purposes.
