Linking CCO Incentive Metrics & WIC's Existing Practices

Thirteen of the 17 incentive metric performances set for Oregon's coordinated care organizations (CCOs) in 2019 demonstrate an opportunity for collaboration between Oregon WIC and CCOs to improve health outcomes. The Metrics and Scoring Committee have identified four metrics (in grey) as focus areas that have impact on early childhood health.
