

Oregon Farm Direct Nutrition Program 2020 Farmer Information

The Oregon Farm Direct Nutrition Program (FDNP) is a state-administered USDA nutrition program that brings more than one million dollars to Oregon farmers each year. FDNP checks are issued to families enrolled in the WIC (Women, Infants & Children) program and eligible low-income seniors to spend with authorized farmers selling directly to consumers.

The green \$4 checks are specifically for locally-produced fresh, unprocessed fruits, vegetables and cut herbs and are valid from June 1 through November 30 each year.
