CLAIMS AND BILLING UPDATE

- All claims received by ScreenWise are manually entered in our system. Based on volume, once a claim is received it may take ScreenWise up to 2 weeks to input the claim into our system.
 - Depending on when the claim is received and the volume of submissions, the claim may not be entered and processed during the month it was received. In such cases, it will be entered and processed in the next payment cycle.
 - Claims are batched and processed on or around the 20th of each month. Explanation of Benefits (EOB) reports are provided around the 25th of each month. The primary function of an EOB is to provide a summary of claims received, paid or denied for the billing cycle.
 - Payments can be expected within 2 weeks of the process date.
- In an effort to improve the payment rates for BCCP and WISEWOMAN Intake fees, please adhere to the following submission recommendations.
 - Breast or cervical diagnosis entered as the first diagnosis for BCC intake/data fees (99080) to be paid. Claims with either a WW or dual (vague) diagnosis as the first diagnosis will be denied and the error message will read: **DENIED: CPT 99080 requires a breast or cervical diagnosis code as the first diagnosis**
 - WISEWOMAN intake fee claims with a WW diagnosis as the first diagnosis will be paid, but claims with a breast, cervical, or WW first diagnosis will be denied and the error message will read: **DENIED: CPT 99429 requires a cardiovascular diagnosis code as the first diagnosis.**

3. Access to Web Database (aka Ahlers)

ScreenWise implemented significant program changes September 2015. One aspect of the changes included removing the requirement of providers to enter data and claim information in the web database also known as Ahlers. All data and claims should be submitted to ScreenWise for processing. If you are currently using the web database, Ahlers, please contact the ScreenWise program to set up training on our new processes and procedures. Implementing the new systems will ensure you and your clinic are ready for future program changes.

DID YOU KNOW?

Enrolling providers are typically FQHCs, Health Departments, Rural Health Centers, Private Clinics, Naturopaths, etc. These clinics provide the care coordination for patients by enrolling patients, providing screening office visits, and often referring to ancillary providers for diagnostics. Many enrolling providers need to refer to ancillary providers for procedures like colposcopies. However, if an enrolling provider is equipped to provide colposcopies in-house they are able to do so under their medical service agreement with ScreenWise.
