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### CLAIMS AND BILLING UPDATE

#### 1. Provider Report – Updated column for claims

ScreenWise now provides an additional column on the provider report to inform whether or not claims have been paid for your patient. This is restricted to paid claims in 2016. This column is meant to be a reminder for providers to submit claims when services have already been provided. Conversely, if there are paid claims but no data submitted, it is also a reminder to submit that data. This new column should help reconcile data and claims more quickly.

#### 2. Data Reminder – Including clinic sites and patient’s names

ScreenWise has a network of approximately 200 facilities serving over 5,000 Oregon patients annually. Due to this volume and concerns for patient privacy, the provider site name and all patient information is crucial to ensuring each patient is assigned to the correct site. Please remember to include the site name and all of the patient’s first and last names on the enrollment form.

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### PROGRAM UPDATE

#### 1. Pilot Project Launch!

We are excited to announce that ScreenWise is piloting our new program model with the following clinics: Virginia Garcia MHC (Beaverton and Cornelius); La Clinica Del Valle (West Medford); Song Bird Healing Arts; Jackson County Public Health; Valley Family Health Care (Nyssa); and Mid-Columbia Medical Center. This is our final step to fully integrate the genetic services, heart screening for women age 40+, and the breast and cervical cancer screening programs. ScreenWise will be closely monitoring and evaluating the pilot project and will expand statewide as soon as possible.

Project Access NOW (located in Portland and Salem) is a great resource for patients who need breast or cervical cancer treatment, but are ineligible for BCCTP or OHP.
