

# SCREENWISE APPROACH

ScreenWise aims to reduce cancer burden and health inequities in breast, cervical, and cancer morbidity and mortality in 5 primary ways.

## 01 Clinical Services (Direct Services)

Securing access to breast, cervical, and hereditary cancer screening and diagnostic services for eligible patients through a statewide network of providers. The program serves between 4000-7000 clients per year.

### Program Eligibility:

Must be resident of Oregon, at or below 250% FPL, and either have no health insurance or have health insurance that is inadequate to cover their needs. Clients must be 50 or over for screening and diagnostic services. Patients between 21-49 are only eligible if they are determined to need diagnostic services.

## 02 Health System Change (Evidence Based Interventions)

EBIs are a collection of strategies for health systems (clinics) to use to help improve breast and cervical cancer screening rates as recommended in the [CDC's Community Guide](#).

We provide funding and technical assistance to health systems partners to implement key EBIs to reduce structural barriers to screening.

## 03 Community-Clinical Linkages

Funding community organizations to provide education and support to encourage screening and address social barriers to care

## 04 Environmental Approach

Working with employers and health plans to help promote breast and cervical cancer screening and early detection.

## 05 Family Health History

Providing education on family health history, hereditary cancer risk and risk reduction.
