ScreenWise Eligibility Training Module

What is ScreenWise?

- The ScreenWise maintains a statewide network of providers, clinics, health systems, labs, and imaging facilities.
- Through these partners, uninsured and underinsured individuals in Oregon receive breast and cervical cancer screening services at no cost.



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Clinical Partner Responsibilities

Clinical partners are required to:

- Sign a Medical Services Agreement with the Oregon Health Authority.
- Determine if an individual meets program eligibility requirements.
- Explain available and covered services and service provider responsibilities to individuals.

Once an individual agrees to screening services

Clinical partners must:

- Enroll eligible individuals into ScreenWise.
- Explain and provide breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic services.
- Report results to ScreenWise whether results are known, or an individual declines recommended services.

Verifying enrollment

Individuals remain enrolled in ScreenWise for one year from the date of enrollment.

If an individual was enrolled in ScreenWise before a provider's time working with them, contact ScreenWise staff to verify enrollment status.

When to re-enroll

Individuals are enrolled for 365 days and are covered for any necessary additional breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic services during that year.

For example, if an individual is enrolled for cervical surveillance and needs follow-up within the same year, the individual does not have to be re-enrolled.

After one year, eligibility needs to be re-verified, and a new enrollment packet must be submitted.



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Services Covered by ScreenWise

Breast services covered by ScreenWise include:

- Clinical breast exam
- Screening mammogram
- Diagnostic mammogram (if additional views are needed)
- Other abnormal follow-up procedures such as ultrasound, fine needle aspiration, biopsy, etc.

Cervical services covered by ScreenWise include:

- Pelvic exam
- Pap smear
- HPV test
- Abnormal follow-up procedures such as colposcopies and diagnostic LEEPs

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ScreenWise Eligibility Requirements

Determining eligibility

ScreenWise enrolling providers determine eligibility by verifying if individuals meet residency, insurance, income, and age requirements.

Status of these requirements is self-declared by the individual.

ScreenWise does not require proof of any of the requirements.

Eligibility requirements

To be enrolled in ScreenWise and receive breast and cervical cancer screening services at no cost, an individual must meet the following: residency, insurance, income, and age requirements.

Residency status

ScreenWise eligible individuals must live in Oregon or intend to live in Oregon.

Insurance status

To be ScreenWise eligible, an individual must either have no health insurance or has health insurance that does not cover their needs.

For example, individuals are eligible if their insurance does not cover screenings or diagnostic services.

Individuals are also eligible if their deductible, copay, or coinsurance is too high for them to pay.

Income

Individuals are eligible for services covered by ScreenWise if they have a household income at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Level.

The Federal Poverty Level is a measure of income created yearly by the Department of Health and Human Services.

Federal Poverty Level calculations according to household size can be found on the [ScreenWise home webpage](#) under Eligibility.

Household size includes the individual, their spouse (if married), and dependents who can be claimed for tax credits or deductions.

Age for screening services

ScreenWise covers breast and cervical cancer screening services for all individuals aged 40 and older.

Screening services are routine testing for individuals without symptoms.

Age for diagnostic services

Individuals aged 18-39 are also eligible for enrollment and can be referred to diagnostic services if a provider deems a diagnostic service necessary. Diagnostic services include:

- Testing to investigate symptoms.
- Further testing if a possible abnormality is found during screening.
- Testing for high-risk individuals due to previous abnormal testing or other factors a provider determines to be valid.
- Testing due to family history.
