



SBHC Mental Health Expansion Grants 2021-2023 Award Requirements

- Clinic(s) must be a State certified SBHC(s) as of June 30, 2021.
- Award monies must be used to support mental health capacity (FTE) within the schoolbased health center system. Grant funding is not intended to supplant existing SBHC mental health capacity that has previously been funded by other means (separate grants, billing, etc.).
- Awardees will be expected to use grant dollars for staff to provide billable services as well as direct services without reimbursement (such as pre-treatment engagement, providing services to uninsured clients, etc.)
- Awardees may use funding to support prevention, education, and outreach activities.
- Awardees will be expected to track and submit data related to mental health encounters as outlined in the SBHC Certification Standards. SBHC Certification Standards are available at www.healthoregon.org/sbhc.
- Awardees will be expected to participate in regular check-in meetings (via phone or email) with the SPO and submit 3 mid-project reports and a final project report.
 Guidance will be given on expected report content.
- SPO may suspend MHEG funding if there are no hours of FTE in MHEG funded positions for greater than 90 days.
- If services are subcontracted to a separate Mental Health Agency, a representative from the Mental Health Agency must participate in an SBHC Orientation training, to be held in fall 2021. The training will be recorded and posted on the SPO website: www.healthoregon.org/sbhc.
- Awardees will be expected to provide culturally responsive health services that are inclusive and welcoming for youth from diverse backgrounds.
- Awardees must prioritize school-aged (5-21) clients for grant-funded services and activities.
- Awardees must have a strategy to ensure students' access to mental/behavioral health services, regardless of their ability to pay.
- Awardees should work with the Medical Sponsor Agency (if different) to coordinate services provided at the SBHC (e.g., policies, workflows, etc.) and meet SBHC Certification Standards requirements.
- Awardees should work with the Medical Sponsor Agency (if different) to support a relationship with the SBHC host school.
- Awardees are expected to report any known suicides to the OHA Suicide Prevention and Intervention Coordinator, per OAR 309-027-0060.
