



Youth-Led Projects Grant 2023-2025 Overview

School-based health centers (SBHCs) are comprehensive health care clinics in or on school grounds dedicated to offering youth centered clinical care. During the 2023-2025 biennium, the Oregon Health Authority will distribute \$800,000 through the SBHC Youth-Led Projects Grant as part of the Mental Health Expansion Grant (MHEG). This funding supports youth-led mental health projects in 29 SBHC / SBHC host schools across 9 counties. The Youth-Led Projects Grant supports activities that reduce mental health stigma, promote SBHC access, prioritize prevention efforts and provide students the opportunity to build community while addressing topics that matter to them.

In the 2021-2023 biennium, Youth-Led Project Grantees:

- Operated Youth Advisory Councils (YACs) YAC projects included:
 - Providing feedback to the SBHC
 - Creating or contributing to clinic promotional materials
- Conducted Youth Participatory Action Research on topics such as:
 - Increasing LGBTQ2SIA+ inclusivity in health class curriculum
 - Identifying and addressing student stress
 - Understanding the need for gender neutral bathrooms
- Distributed mental health related information and resources:
 - Hosted podcasts and video projects
 - o Created social media accounts, resource websites and printed materials
- Employed youth interns who:
 - o Organized youth wellness / mental health summit
 - Facilitated YAC meetings
 - o Presented to school administration around students' health care needs
- Organized social and educational events, such as:
 - Movie nights, game nights and self-defense classes
 - Wellness events such as wilderness retreats, culture fairs, mental health awareness weeks, pride events and guest speakers' series
- Collaborated with other school clubs or organizations including culturally specific community-based organizations, student affinity groups, athletic teams and suicide prevention programs.
