



School-Based Health Centers Suggested Practices

Companion Document to Standards for Certification, Version 4 Updated June 2018

This document is meant to provide some basic guidance for existing certified school-based health centers (SBHCs), and may be useful to sites planning for an SBHC. It is not a comprehensive guide, nor does it address all clinical best practices. The intent of the document is to provide a foundation on which to build a successful, sustainable center. This document is not a prescribed check list of items or ideas; rather, this document refers to other documents, websites and resources to help support your efforts. This document is also intended to help persons new to the SBHC model have some array of resources at hand.

This document is a companion to the <u>Oregon School-Based Health Centers Standards for Certification</u>, <u>Version 4</u>. The majority of this document is structured so that it follows the outline format of the certification standards. For example, if you have a question about Table 2 in the standards and what 'Provision of age appropriate anticipatory guidance' means, then you would look in this document for any explanation or resource available. Not all elements of the certification standards have a listed resource.

By law, employers have a responsibility to protect their workers regardless of whether they're surrounded by colleagues or alone on an assignment. Staff should not be onsite alone during hours of operation. A safety plan should include: assessment of risk; and administrative, work practice & environmental controls that are reasonable for the setting. School appropriate safety plans might include: communication systems that connect SBHC staff with school safety and school administrative employees; training lone workers on emergency response; establishing a clear action plan in the event of an emergency; setting limits for what is permissible during lone work; requiring supervisors to make periodic visits to lone workers; ensure regular contact between lone workers and supervisors via phone or radio; using automatic warning devices that alert others if signals are not received periodically from a lone worker; and/or verifying that lone workers are accounted for after completing a task, or work day.
