Memorandum to all ODIE users

Please read the following memo carefully, as it contains important information on accessing ORELAP's database for accreditation needs.

High-level summary:

- 1) There will be a planned ODIE outage overnight from 7/22 to 7/23/2026
- 2) ODIE will be accessed from a new web page starting on 7/23/2026
- 3) All users will access ODIE using Microsoft B2C multi-factor authentication starting 7/23/2026

The ORELAP Data Input and Edit (ODIE) web portal is migrating to a new web address which will utilize a different login process, with multi-factor authentication, starting on Wednesday, July 22, 2026. While the interface and functionality of ODIE will not change noticeably, the web address (also known as the URL) where you access the database will change. During the migration process, there will be a planned ODIE outage starting at 5:00 pm Pacific Time on Wednesday, July 22, 2026 until completion on the morning of Thursday July 23rd. During this time, ODIE will not be accessible at either the old or new URLs. Please plan accordingly! We will send out notification when the new URL is live on July 23rd, 2026.

Starting on July 23rd, 2026, please use the following link to access ODIE:

We recommend bookmarking this in your preferred browser for easy access. Our webpages will also contain the updated link.

When logging into the new URL for ODIE, you will be taken to a Microsoft B2C (Business-to-Consumer) web address. While it may look different from what you are familiar with, **this is expected** and is the new multi-factor authentication platform used to log into ODIE. The B2C platform relies on sending a unique code to your email address as well as a password to authenticate your identity. Because the unique code must be entered along with the password, you must have access to the email address associated with the user ID. There may be instances where laboratories have been using an ODIE login associated with an old email address. For example, the laboratory's email address domain name may have changed from when you first established your ODIE login. If you do not have access to the email address associated with your existing ODIE login, you will need to request a new registration in the ODIE portal using the email address you have access to after you have been authenticated using B2C.

I understand this change may take some getting used to and thank you in advance for your understanding as we continually work to make ODIE easier to use and more secure.
