Title:Call for cases: Pediatric influenza-associated encephalopathy

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has distributed a call for cases of pediatric influenza-associated encephalopathy and encephalitis during the 2024-25 influenza season.

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) is collaborating with CDC to investigate <u>reports</u> of influenza-associated encephalopathy and encephalitis (IAE), including acute necrotizing encephalopathy (ANE), in children < 18 years of age. In early 2025, CDC was notified of several anecdotal reports of pediatric cases of influenza-associated ANE, including 2 deaths. There is currently no national surveillance for IAE or ANE, and it is not known whether reported cases are within or above expected ranges.

OHA asks all clinicians statewide to report any cases of pediatric IAE or ANE in Oregon who meet the following four criteria:

- 1. Age < 18 years at time of symptom onset.
- 2. Admitted to an acute care hospital or pronounced dead in an emergency department between October 1, 2024--May 31, 2025.
- 3. Laboratory-confirmed influenza infection within 14 days preceding hospital presentation, during hospitalization, or in specimens collected post-mortem
- 4. Document neurologic abnormalities (must meet any one or more of the following):
- -Diagnosis of encephalopathy or encephalitis
- -Neurologic signs or symptoms lasting > 24 hours, including but not limited to seizures, altered mental status, delirium, decreased level of consciousness, lethargy, hallucinations, or personality change
- -Electroencephalogram (EEG) abnormalities
- -Abnormal brain autopsy findings
