

Title:FDA Warning RE: certain over-the-counter eye drops

Dear partners,

The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is warning consumers not to purchase and to immediately stop using certain over-the-counter eye drop products due to the potential risk of eye infections that could result in partial vision loss or blindness. Patients who have signs or symptoms of an eye infection after using these products should talk to their health care provider or seek medical care immediately. Common symptoms can be found on US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) conjunctivitis webpage:

Providers should ask patients with signs or symptoms of eye infection if they have used any eye drop products recently and report adverse events, or quality problems.
