This page was created to present licensing data as directed in ORS 475A.374, including the number of licenses issued by license type (1a), number of applications submitted by license type (1b), and the number of denials and reasons for denials (1b).

Licensing Tables

The Licensing Tables include data on the total number of applications received by OPS, the number of licenses issued (approved status), and the total number of license denials, all by license type. All denials are final orders which are posted to the <u>Oregon Psilocybin Services – Final Orders webpage</u>. Detailed information about reasons for denials can be found in the OPS rules <u>333-333-4130</u>. Licensing Tables also include the number of license renewals, by license type.

Training Program Tables

Psilocybin training programs must have their curriculum approved by Oregon Psilocybin Services (OPS) and they must be licensed by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) or receive a determination from HECC that a license is not required. Training Program tables present data regarding Training Program curriculum approvals. To see a list of approved training programs, visit the Current Active Psilocybin Training Programs page.

Table 2 of the Licensing Tables presents data on licenses and permits once approvals have been issued and following them until expiration, renewal, or administrative action.

Licensing Limitations

Statuses will appear on the licensing tables once at least one license holds that status. Licenses that are "renewed" status will also have "approved" status, therefore the totals will only count a renewed license as a single license in the tables on this page.

TLC development is ongoing and its functionality has been evolving which is reflected in the data. Certain development was not available in 2023 when applications for licenses began. Internal licensing and compliance processes have also developed over time and new legislative and rule changes will have an impact on license and applications statuses and timelines from the start of the program to present day. Keep these considerations in mind when viewing historical totals using the date slider. Under ORS 475A, psilocybin facilitator training programs must receive curriculum approval through OPS. Training programs may also be subject to licensure, exemption, and regulation through the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC). Table 1 of the Training Program Curriculum Approval Tables charts the submission, review, and approval of training program curriculum approval applications to OPS. Statuses presented do not include applications which have been submitted but have not yet begun to be reviewed or assigned to OPS staff members. Table 2 of the Training Program Curriculum Approval Tables presents data on training program curriculum approvals once approvals have been issued and following them until expiration, renewal, or administrative action.

Training Program Curriculum Approval Limitations

Statuses will appear on the training program tables once at least one application for training program curriculum approval holds that status.

Beginning January 1, 2025, the term for training program curriculum approval has been changed from five years to one year. This change is not retroactive. For applications approved prior to January 1, 2025, training program curriculum approval still has a term of five years from the date of initial approval.



Oregon Psilocybin Services Data Dashboard Compliance Page

Overview

Under ORS 475A, OPS will investigate complaints, incidents, or concerns related to statute and rule violations that occur on licensed premises and during the provision of psilocybin services. Investigations are to gather evidence and may not necessarily result in administrative actions.

Licensees, clients, and any member of the public can <u>File a Complaint</u> on the OPS website, by phone, or by email. Our section investigates complaints, incidents, or concerns related to safety issues or statute and rule violations that occur on licensed premises and during the provision of psilocybin services.

Administrative sanctions depend on the severity of violation and may include restriction of a license, civil penalties, or suspension or revocation of a license. ORS 475A.374 requires reporting of disciplinary actions taken by OPS. Final orders for administrative violations are published on our website under the OPS Data Dashboard. To see all Final Orders issued by OPS, please visit the Oregon Psilocybin Services – Final Orders webpage.

Overview

Oregon Psilocybin Services (OPS) rules support client safety in many ways, including rules on facilitator conduct, client safety and support planning, transportation planning, informed consent, client bill of rights, duty to contact emergency services and other requirements.

Under OAR 333-333, facilitators and service centers are required to make reasonable efforts to resolve any activity or conditions on the licensed premises that endangers the safety of any person present on the premises; however, if the activity or conditions cannot be resolved, service centers must contact emergency services and notify OPS. Although this reported event is for internal use by OPS for safety and compliance purposes, OPS shares the number of reports to emergency services and number of psilocybin products sold in the regulated model for transparency.

Session Information Tables

SB 303 required collection of the information reported below, including data regarding administration sessions (e.g., total number of clients served, individual administration sessions, group administration sessions) as well as averages computed from average calculations provided by service centers (average number of clients participating in group administration sessions, average number of times per client that psilocybin services were received, and average dosage in mg).

OPS has sourced additional data from the TLC system in order to provide a more comprehensive picture regarding client safety including total the number of psilocybin products sold in regulated model.

Service center locations will vary, offering a range of experiences to clients, such as individual, group, or outdoor administration sessions. For group administration sessions, client-facilitator ratios are required to support client safety. Group administration sessions may not exceed a total of 25 clients, regardless of the number of facilitators present. A service center may not host administrative sessions for more than 100 clients at any given time regardless of whether the clients are participating in separate individual or group administration sessions.

Clients must remain at the licensed service center for the minimum duration of time depending on the dosage they consume and may be required to stay longer if they are still experiencing the effects of consuming psilocybin.

Client Denial Tables

SB 303 required collection of the information reported below, including number of individuals who were denied psilocybin services and the reasons for those denials.

Reasons for service denial are measured as required by SB 303, including having taken the prescription drug Lithium in the past 30 days, ideation of causing harm to self or others, being previously diagnosed or treated for active psychosis, and other reasons listed in the client denial tables.

Reaction Information Tables

In accordance with ORS 475A.372, service centers must report the number of Adverse Reactions (medical, behavioral, severe medical, severe behavioral) and 72-hour post-session reactions, which are reported on this page.

OPS has sourced additional data from the TLC system in order to provide a more comprehensive picture regarding client safety in the reaction information table, including number of reports of emergency services being contacted by licensed facilitators and service center representatives and number of product safety recalls in regulated model.

Method

Number of products recalled due to safety reflects the number of psilocybin products sold within the regulated model in Oregon. This does not reflect psilocybin products sold in the unregulated market.

Under OAR 333-333, licensed facilitators may decline services to clients for any reason but may also refer clients to other licensed facilitators that may have more experience serving specific needs.

OPS rules require safe manufacturing processes based on existing agricultural and food safety standards. Production of psilocybin by chemical synthesis and use of adulterants is prohibited. Allowable product types include dried, whole mushrooms; ground, homogenized mushrooms; extracts; or edible food products. OPS rules measure the potency of psilocybin in milligrams. This measurement helps determine how long an administration session may last to support client safety. Manufacturers label their products with potency information based on required test results.

ORS 475A requires products to be tracked in a product tracking system, beginning when detectable psilocybin is cultivated and continuing through the life of the product. Product tracking ensures accountability, helps prevent diversion, creates public health safety for product recalls, and helps to prevent interstate commerce.

Limitations

Safety data are not limited to this dashboard page. For example, some data on the demographics pages may illuminate aspects of safety such as cultural or psychological safety that are not included on the present page.

It is important to recognize that there may be other reasons for client service denials that could contribute to of higher number of denials for other reasons being reported relative to specific reasons listed.

The number of products sold may include secondary doses and is dependent on accurate reporting by licensees. This value depends





does not reflect psilocybin products sold in the unregulated market.

Overview

Psilocybin products may only be sold and transferred to clients by licensee representatives of a service center. Licensee representatives of a service center may only sell and transfer products to clients consistent with dosage, product type and method of consumption determined by a facilitator and client during the client's preparation session.

OPS has sourced additional data from the TLC system in order to provide a more comprehensive picture regarding client safety including the data presented in the Product and Sales Tables.

ORS 475A requires products to be tracked in a product tracking system, beginning when detectable psilocybin is cultivated and continuing through the life of the product. Product tracking ensures accountability, helps prevent diversion, creates public health safety for product recalls, and helps to prevent interstate commerce.

Clients must remain at the licensed service center for the minimum duration of time depending on the dosage they consume and may be required to stay longer if they are still experiencing the effects of consuming psilocybin.




