What is ORELAP?

Oregon Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program

ORELAP is responsible for accreditation of laboratories performing analysis of drinking water, environmental, cannabis and psilocybin samples.

ORELAP is in the Public Health Division of Oregon Health Authority.

Health Authority

What is laboratory accreditation?

For ORELAP, accreditation is:

"The process by which an agency or organization **evaluates** and **recognizes** a laboratory as meeting certain predetermined qualifications or standards..."

What is the TNI Standard?

TNI = The NELAC Institute

A national consensus-based standard for environmental laboratory accreditation




ORELAP laboratories at a glance...




ORELAP and Psilocybin

- Actively working on administrative rules regarding accreditation of psilocybin testing laboratories
 - Ballot Measure 109 passed November 2020, ORELAP to begin accrediting psilocybin laboratories in advance of January 2, 2023 start date for Oregon Psilocybin Program license applications.









ORELAP and Psilocybin

- Final testing and draft laboratory accreditation rules:
 - Potency (HPLC) of Psilocybin analyte,
 Psilocin analyte, and Total Potential
 Psilocin
 - Speciation test of whole dried mushrooms (PCR)
 - Psilocybe cubensis is the sole allowable species
 - Residual solvents methanol and acetic acid
 - Random and representative sampling of psilocybin products
