DECEMBER TASKS

- 1.) Finalize priorities for 2023
- 2.) Discuss federal law and plan for attempt to meet with US Attorney's office
 - a. Might be better to reach out when program is well established; there may also be positive changes that occur
 - b. Board leadership could reach out
- 3.) Monitor and study federal laws, regulations, and policies regarding psilocybin (e.g., presentation from an expert on federal law) could DOJ lawyers help with this?
 - a. Presentation?
 - b. Should 3.) happen before 2.)?
 - c. There is no set timeline so could be a lower priority; this goes for #2 as well
- 4.) Define safety, affordability, and accessibility
 - a. Safety
 - i. Is there any reporting requirement? complaints/adverse events? To be finalized
 - Research data? Drug overdose data dashboard data may be available (OHA level data; substance-related outcomes, ED level data; maybe could request adding a data point related to psilocybin services? ER/chief complaint/medical examiner info)
 - iii. Workforce safety employees, worksites, facilitators; what data will be available?
 - b. Affordability
 - i. Clients cost of services ask clients or facilitators (survey?)
 - ii. Licensees cost of becoming an operator; growth of cost; small business costs
 - iii. Organizations/facilitators that serve clients with less financial resources; this includes any scholarship programs

c. Accessibility

- Easing the licensing process; What is available to help license applicants navigate the process – technical assistance from OHA; information available; TLC system will track completed versus non-completed versus denied applications; renter vs owner – is that affecting service center licensing – probably would need to be part of a survey?
- ii. Where are services available? OHA will be providing information about where ordinances have been passed; Psilocybin services section is developing a GIS mapping tool to help providers follow school proximity requirements
- iii. What outreach and education is being provided to potential clients and facilitators; ensuring that feedback is being heard and considered (so far: fact sheet in English and Spanish; public listening sessions; 10,000 subscribers on distribution list; outreach to 50 community-based groups; 30 presentations in the past year; training will be available; outreach to additional communitybased organizations ongoing)
- iv. Language accessibility OHA may have some data but shareability may be an issue due to privacy issues
- 5.) Subcommittee structuring/discussion
 - a. Resource constraints 2 total meetings per month between subcommittee and OPAB meetings

b. Reconvene licensing subcommittee – how is licensing process going? May be a good setting to finalize process for developing board-board agreements? Help reiterate guidance on separation between facilitation and licensed profession

- 5.) Licensure Board to Licensure Board agreements for dual-licensed providers (Psilocybin services has reached out to establish relationships Psilocybin Services has presented to most/all professional Boards)

 - This may end up requiring more specific legislative action to direct licensing boards
