## **Notes from February 2025 meeting:**

- Gratitude to Emily for reading the grounding statement.
- Notes from November meeting reviewed and approved.
- Discussed membership changes. Amanda Nadell, Multnomah County Chief Deputy District
  Attorney, is a new regular member taking over from Chuck Mickley. Lani Williams representing
  OYA, replacing Robin Marshal. Mary McCord will be representing the Department of Early
  Learning and Care (Katrina Gannon-Peterson attended the February meeting, will tag team).
  Shanda Hochstetler is now representing OHA Behavioral Health. The group expressed
  appreciation for past members' service on the team.
- Shanda updated the group on Retrospective Suicide Analysis (RSA), formerly known as
  psychological autopsy, which is piloting in Deschutes County. Members expressed interest in
  inviting Matchstick Consulting (OHA contractor leading this work) to a future meeting to provide
  more background on RSA. They are working on a form that county postvention leads can use
  to request an RSA, as well as a memo to let counties know this resource is available.
- Laura shared information about the National Overdose Fatality Review Summit, held in Portland in early February. Conference presentation materials are available at <a href="https://ofrtools.org/Learn/Forums/2025NationalForum/Presentations">https://ofrtools.org/Learn/Forums/2025NationalForum/Presentations</a>.
- The group reviewed a paper on child maltreatment and sleep related deaths and discussed the possibility of sharing the information with county teams. While the portion on objective measures contributing to death seems very helpful, some members of the State Team had concerns about the neglect portion of the guideline. Follow up with the AAP regarding the neglect portion of the guideline.
- Members discussed several bills of interest that have been introduced so far in the state legislative session, and will circle back in May to discuss bills that are still moving:





- o HB 3706 parental admission of minors, children in care
- HB 3715 definition of "danger to self or others"
- HB 3631 youth substance use prevention educational campaign
- Reviewed prevention recommendations from three child fatality cases and identified issues for further clarification/follow-up with county coordinators.
- Updates:
  - Randall Children's Hospital has received a grant from the ODOT Transportation Safety
    Office for a child car seat project, which will focus on booster aged children, reach out to
    Amber with referrals.
  - The OHA EMS Program is recruiting for statewide committees, including pediatric specific positions. Click <u>here</u> to apply. Details about the application process are included in the <u>Application Guide</u>. Questions can be sent to <u>ems.program@odhsoha.oregon.gov</u>.

  - The updated Youth Suicide Intervention, Prevention and Postvention report will be released soon. The team is celebrating reduced youth suicide numbers, announcing a mandate and commitment to supporting youth of color, and celebrating 5 years of Big River suicide prevention training the state has doubled the number of tribal-identified trainers, and close to doubled Spanish speaking trainers.
  - Emily invited members to participate in upcoming Multnomah County reviews (March 7, May 2).
- Next quarterly meeting will be May 25. Amber and Cynthia volunteered for county outreach on cases to be discussed in May. Taylor Chambers volunteered to monitor the chat and Lani Williams will read the grounding statement.
