### Notes from August meeting:

- Gratitude to Taylor Chambers for reading the grounding statement
- Continuing Education Credits are available for completing the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention Child Death Investigation training modules
- Team name change is official – Child Death Review and Prevention Team going forward
- Subgroup to support the Oregon State Medical Examiners has begun to seek an understanding of the needs of the State Medical Examiner Office. Inclusion of Dr. Hurst in conversations Deb arranges with other states regarding ME infrastructure.
- Member changes – Kara Boulahanis with Oregon Department of Education (ODE) accepted a new position with ODE. Deb is working with ODE to identify a new member. Jay Messenger with ELD, Office of Childcare has accepted a new position with Department of Revenue. Deb is working with Office of Child Care to identify a new member. John Casalino accepted a new position with DOJ. His position was a designee of the Statewide District Attorney Association, who is the state team member. This designee position is now being filled by Chuck Mickley with Multnomah County District Attorney's Office. Chuck has been with the office since 1998 and is in charge of the MDT unit. Deb has offered exit interviews to all members who are offboarding.

- Heather Morrow-Almeida discussed a funding opportunity related to drowning prevention. The National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention is pleased to launch the Drowning Death Scene Investigation and Child Death Review (CDR) Project. <https://ncfrp.org/cdr/drowning-case-registry/> Please reach out to Heather if you have interest in collaborating. Karen Ayers can assist with making connections to the Water Safety Taskforce. Other members also offered some support.
- An update on changes identified through county needs assessment – particularly around the website – we are on schedule to go live with new website by end of summer. This is contained within the OHA website. Child Death Review and Prevention is broader than the state team. It includes CIRT, county team resources, state team resources and function, etc. There will be a calendar to identify upcoming trainings that could benefit county teams. There will be a map that reflects how to contact the CDR team in each county. A data dashboard displaying data from the case reporting system is in the works with a goal of end of year.
- A collaboration tool for the state team is being explored to make communication and collaboration easier, with shared and secure documents.
- A need for a membership subgroup was identified. No volunteers.
- State Medical Examiner Office Update – MEO was able to recruit two forensic pathologists. One of the doctors recruited quit already. Caseload increase in last two years means even with new hire, it will reduce the time Dr. Hurst has to devote to county coordination and communication projects in 2023.
- County Team Support –A meeting will be scheduled by Deb for those members assigned to a county team to discuss what is/is not working and potentially explore a different path towards supporting counties.
- Safe Sleep Coalition is hosting a listening session for county teams in September.
- Discussed the transition to the roles and responsibilities outlined in the charter. Understanding this is a big change, not all current members may wish to continue to serve. Discussed specific changes to expectations and agreed each member to acknowledge renewed commitment or express desire to transition off the team.
- Discussed providing written guidance to county teams for conducting reviews in the absence of toxicology. This is acceptable considering the balance to being closer to real time review. Without toxicology there is a lot of information that is known, and it is only occasional that toxicology results impact the findings.
- Consider getting information from Oregon Parenting Education Collaborative (OPEC) on parenting education resources to medical providers.
- Consider Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) certification for some county team members.
- Next meeting agenda to focus on suicide and injury prevention data and furthering work that is underway.
