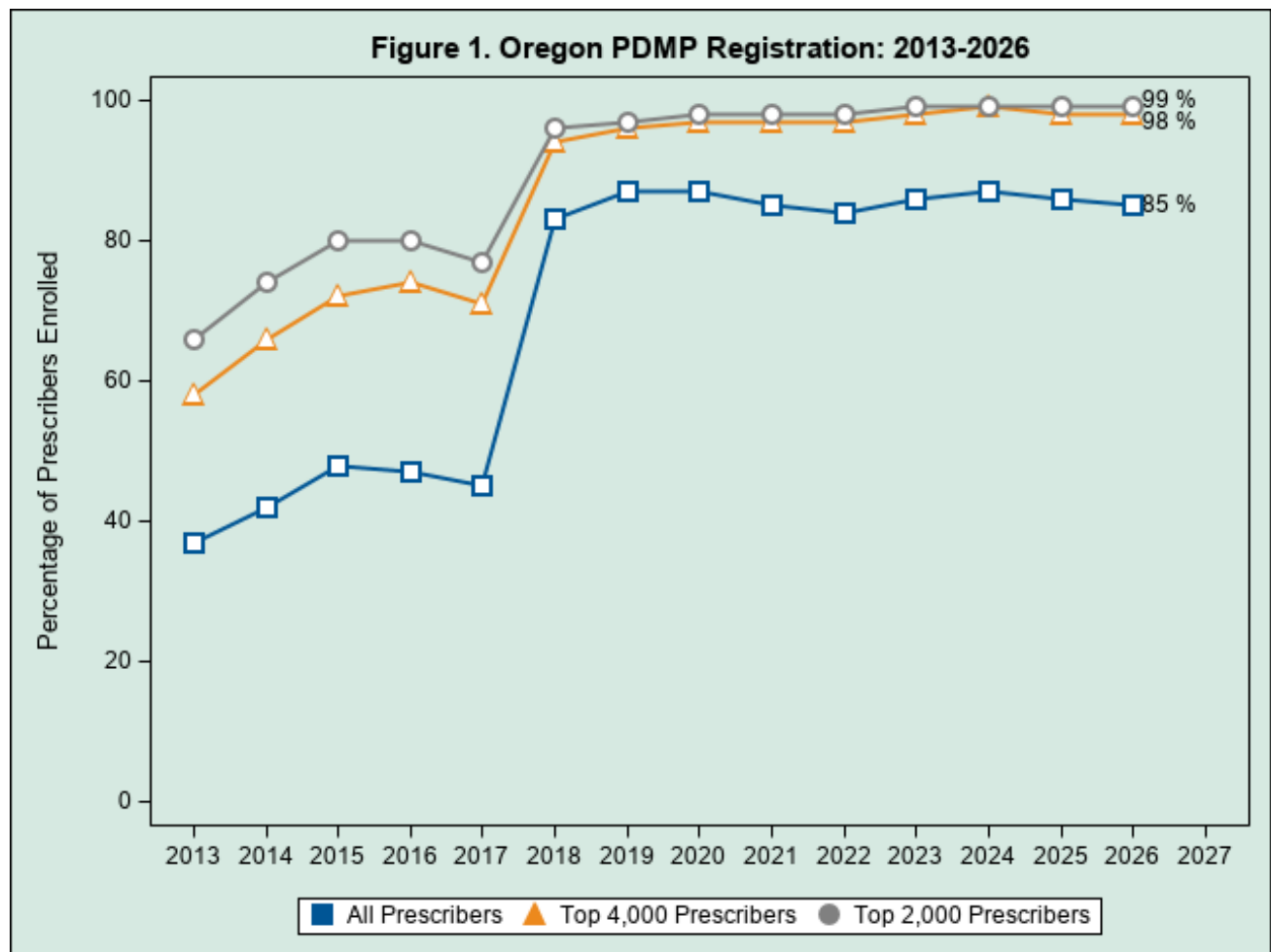


1st Quarter 2026 Report (January 1 - March 31)

Percent change evaluated relative to 1st Quarter 2025

Summary

- The percentage of prescribers enrolled in the PDMP system has stayed consistent compared to the 1st quarter of 2025 (Figure 1, Table 1).
- PDMP staff received and processed 70 special requests. Healthcare boards were the most frequent originators of these requests (Table 2).
- Web portal usage increased 3.6% over last year. Gateway queries and reports viewed also increased 11.9% and 11.4%, respectively. Healthcare providers were largely the drivers of the activity increase (Table 3).
- Usage trends by discipline continue to show an ongoing shift towards integrated gateway use and reduced reliance on the web portal (Table 4).
- Total prescriptions increased 3.5% overall over last year. Stimulant prescriptions continue upward trends with amphetamine prescriptions increasing 9.3% and methylphenidate increasing 13.7%. Gabapentin (-6.4%), oxycodone (-0.2%), and hydrocodone (-3.8%) prescriptions decreased over the year (Table 5).
- Gateway integration remained stable with modest increases in both active facilities and active users (Figure 2, Figure 3).
- As of January 2025, the Oregon PDMP includes Schedule V and veterinarian-prescribed drugs.



- *Figure 1* shows the number of prescribers enrolled in the PDMP over time from 2013-2026. Registration has remained consistent since 2018.

- Controlled substances were prescribed by 20,499 Oregon providers.

- During the 1st quarter, 79.1% of enrolled prescribers, 92.7% of the top 4,000 prescribers, and 92.9% of the top 2,000 prescribers submitted queries via the web portal and/or gateway integration.
- Query activity increased compared to Q1 2025 when 76.6% of enrolled prescribers submitted queries.

- Web portal queries increased (3.6%), largely driven by healthcare providers.

- Automated queries and reports viewed also increased 11.9% and 11.4%, respectively. Healthcare providers were the main driver of the increases in activity.

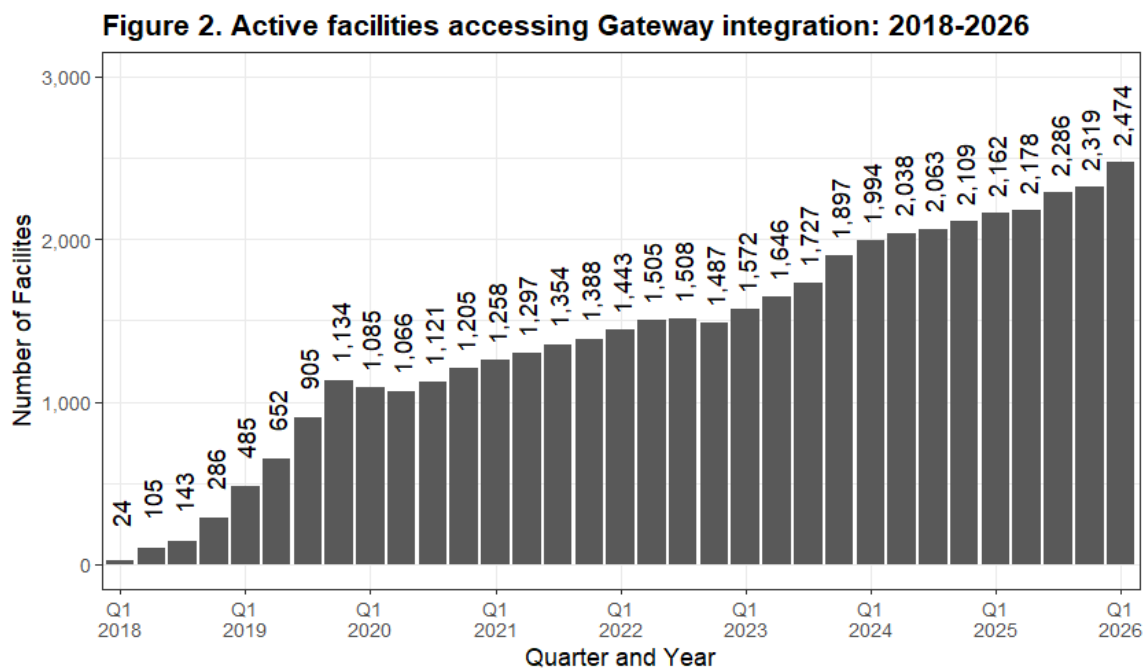
- Delegate accounts increased 11.5%, while other disciplines had more modest increases or decreases.
- Usage trends for some disciplines continue to show an ongoing shift towards integrated gateway use and reduced reliance on the web portal.
- All prescriber groups increased integrated gateway usage with ND (+10.1%), DDS/DMD (8.3%), and RPh (+6.8%) disciplines increased usage the most.

- Controlled substance prescribing increased 3.5% over last year.
- Stimulant prescribing continues to increase. Amphetamine (+9.3%) remains the most prescribed drug and methylphenidate prescriptions increased (+13.7%).
- Gabapentin (-6.4%), oxycodone (-0.2%), and hydrocodone (-3.8%) prescriptions decreased over the year.

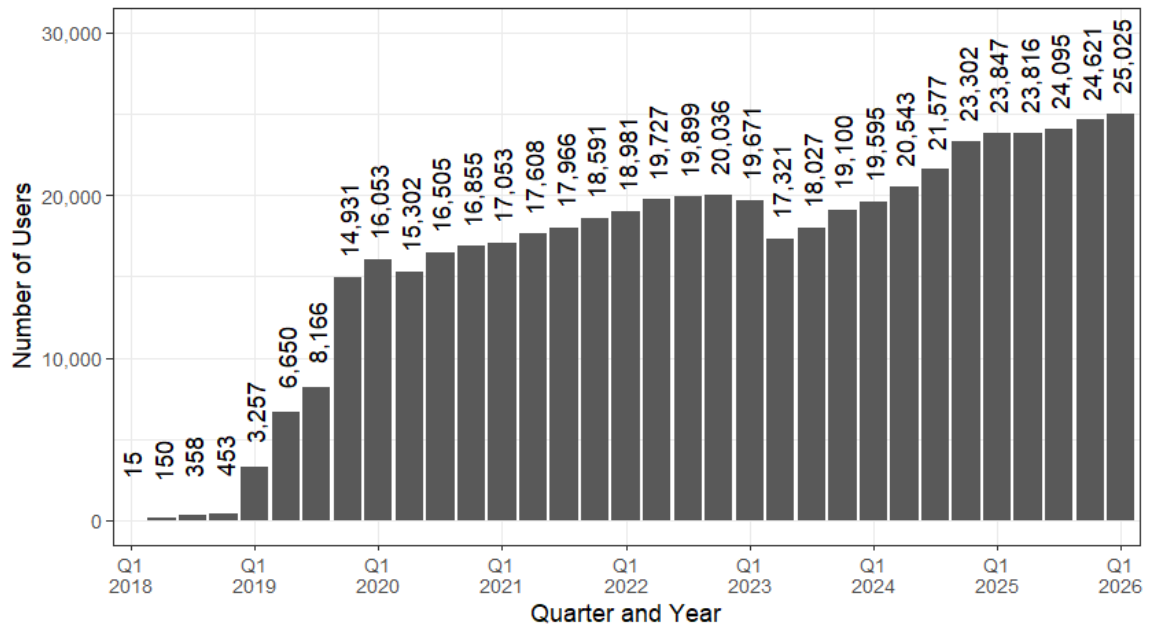
Gateway Integration Trends

- Facility participation in gateway increased to 2,474.
