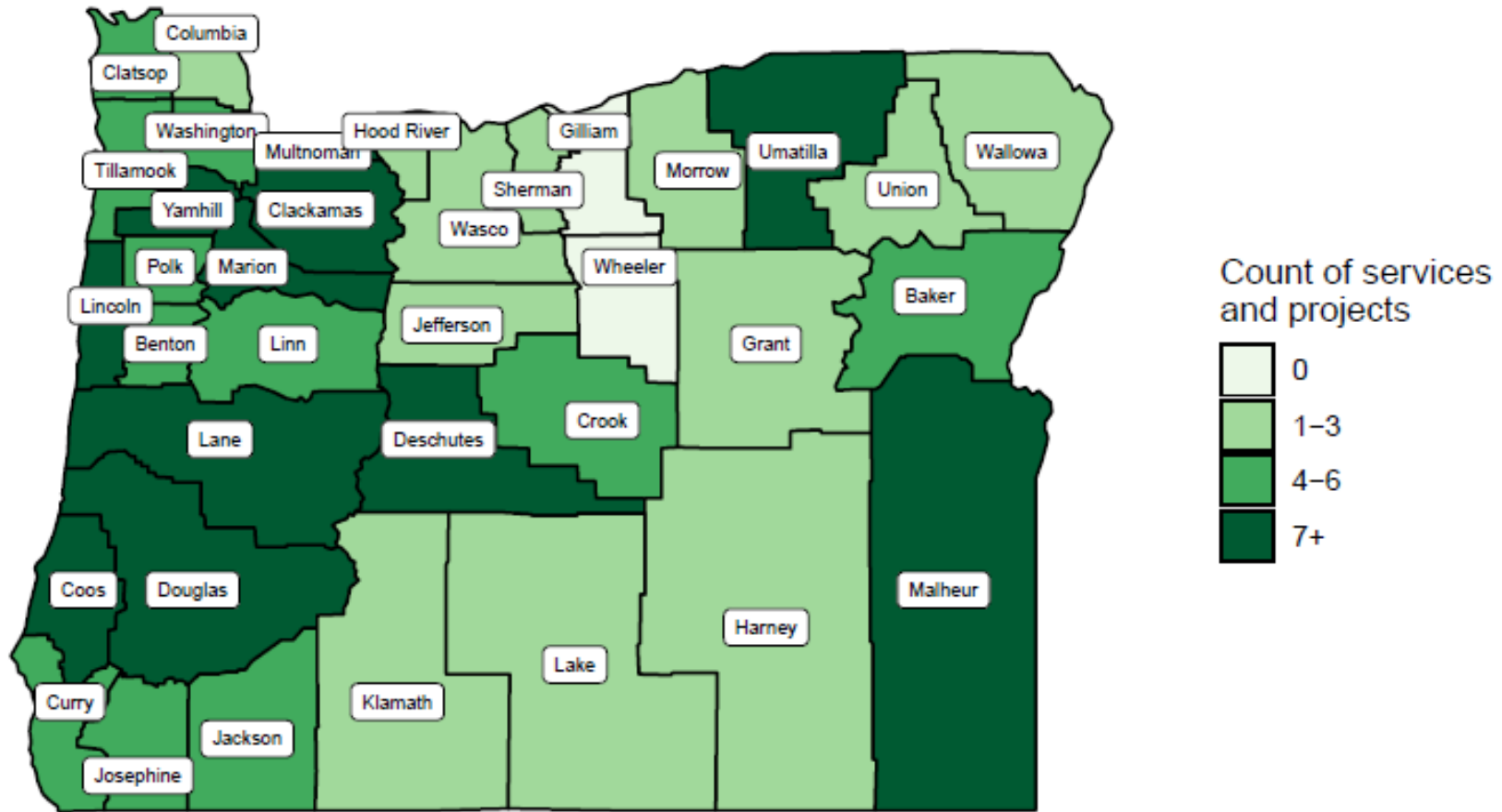

The counties listed on the map and in Table 2 are the initial counties piloted with the Heal Safely messages.

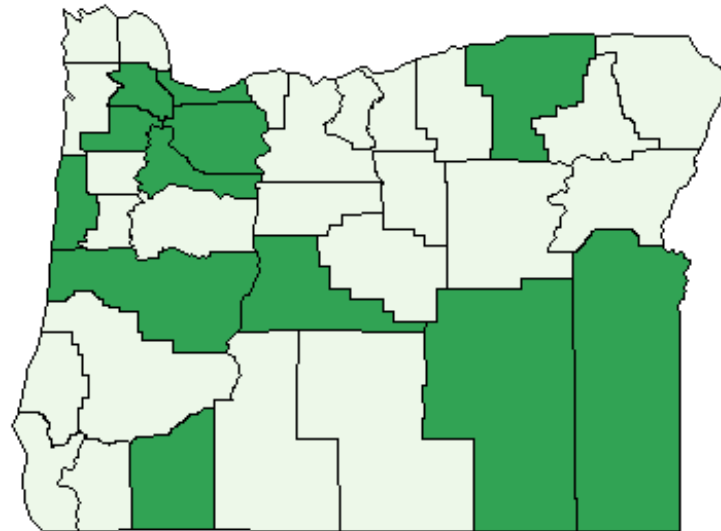


Reverse Overdose Oregon Campaign

The counties listed on the map and in Table 2 are the pilot counties receiving the initial Reverse Overdose Oregon campaign materials.

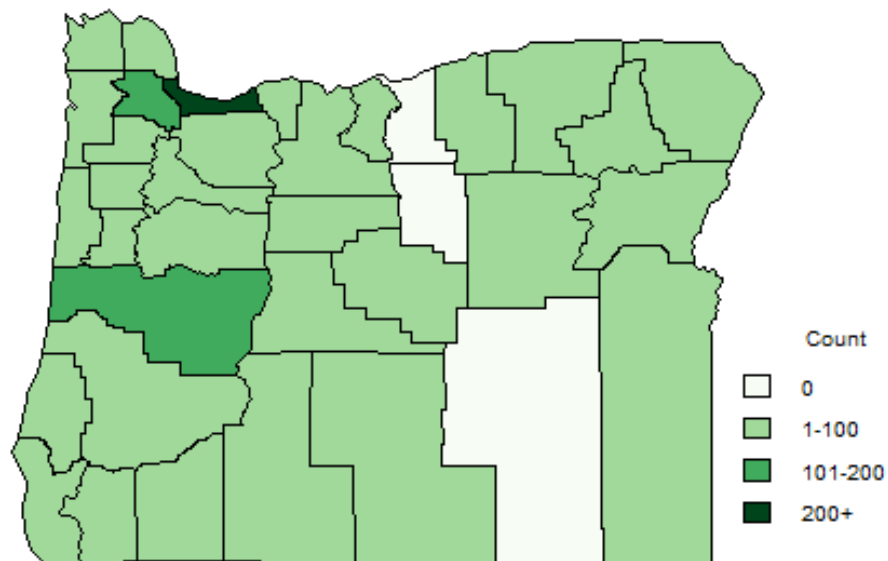


X-Waivered Buprenorphine Practitioners

An X waiver permits practitioners to prescribe Suboxone (buprenorphine/naloxone) for opioid use disorder patients under the Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 2000 (DATA 2000). SAMHSA handles the application process for practitioners who want to prescribe buprenorphine for opioid addiction treatment.

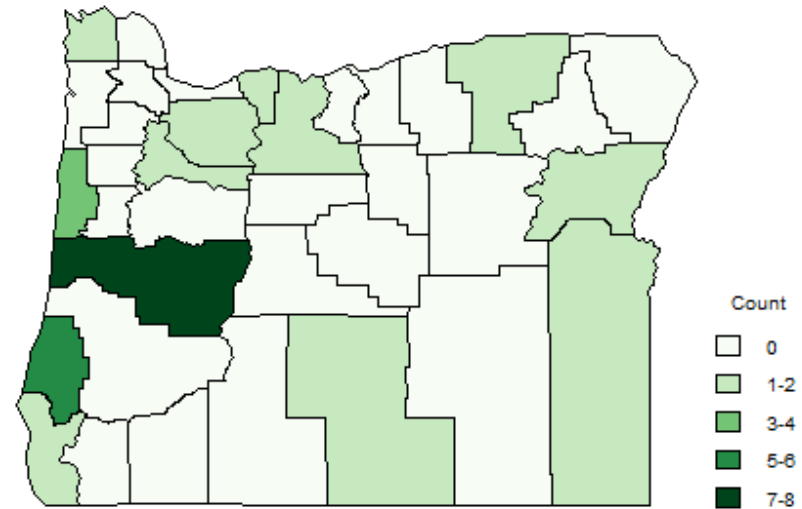

PINPOINT Clinics

Oregon Rural Practice-based Research Network (ORPRN), funded under CDC’s Overdose Data to Action grant and in collaboration with Synergy Consulting, Comagine Health, and the National Resource Center for Academic Detailing (NARCAD), will be [using practice facilitation and academic detailing strategies](#) to improve pain and opioid management in 60 primary care clinics in Oregon. Implementation will occur in 3 waves that will begin in May 2020, August 2020, and November 2020.

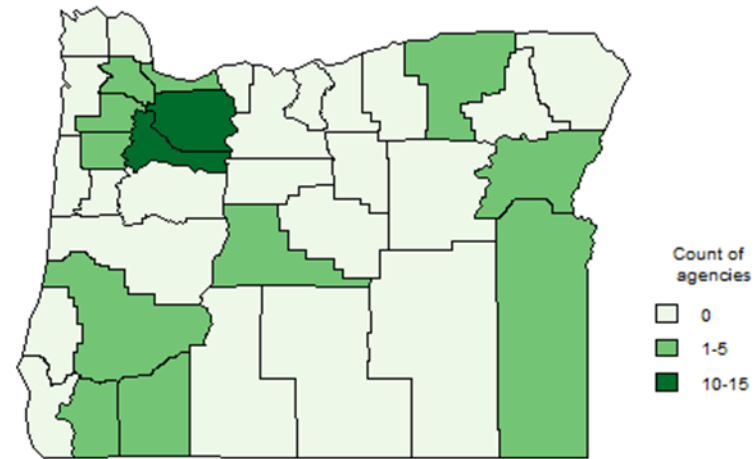

Overdose Detection and Mapping Application Program (ODMAP)

[ODMAP](#) provides near real-time suspected overdose surveillance data across jurisdictions to support public safety and public health efforts to mobilize an immediate response to a sudden increase, or spike in overdose events. It links first responders and relevant record management systems to a mapping tool to track overdoses to stimulate real-time response and strategic analysis across jurisdictions.

Each agency wishing to participate, signs a data sharing agreement which is designed to protect the data within the system. Once signed, they can begin uploading data in real time and access to the ODMAP dashboard, which allows users to view nationwide data. This tool is only available to government (state, local, federal, or tribal) agencies serving the interests of public safety and health. ODMAP is funded by the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy's (ONDCP) High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA) program and there is no cost to agencies who utilize it.



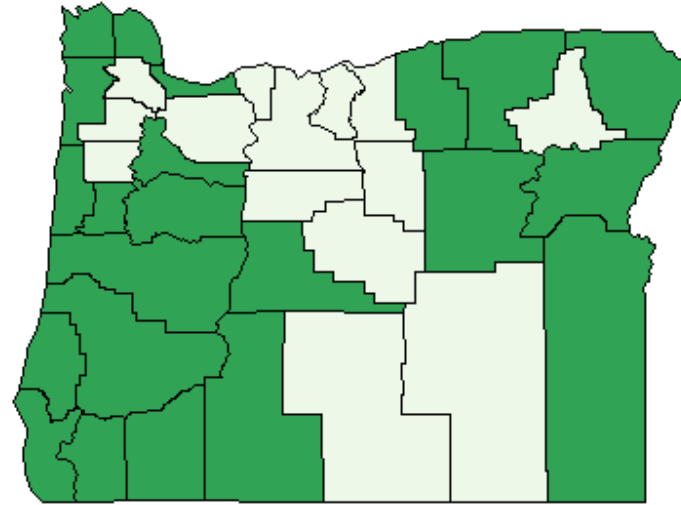

Peer Recovery Initiated in Medical Establishments + HCV/HIV Testing and Linkage to Care (PRIME+)

The initial Peer Recovery Initiated in Medical Establishments (PRIME) program was funded as a pilot program through House Bill 4143 passed during the state's 2018 legislative session. The pilot peer recovery program, led by the Health System's Division (HSD's) Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment, Recovery, & Prevention Unit, sought to reduce overdoses by placing Peer Recovery Support Specialists in emergency departments to provide harm reduction based peer support, support naloxone access, and link interested participants to SUD treatment. Peer Recovery Support Specialists are people with lived experience with substance use who work with people who use substances in a variety of settings, including medical settings. The legislature designated Multnomah, Marion, Jackson, and Coos as the initial pilot program sites.



In 2019, the State Opioid Response (SOR) funding from the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) expanded the successful peer recovery support specialist work to 14 sites in 15 counties. The peer recovery specialist program also expanded beyond the emergency department sites to include primary care, urgent care, and county health department clinics. The 2019 expansion counties included Columbia, Clatsop, Tillamook, Lincoln, Klamath, Josephine, Douglas, Lane, Deschutes, Morrow/Grant, Umatilla, Wallowa, Malheur, and Baker. In late 2019, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued a one-year grant for state Public Health Viral Hepatitis Programs to develop HCV screening and Linkage to Care intervention models for people who inject drugs in rural counties. The SUD Treatment, Recovery and Prevention Unit, and the Viral Hepatitis Program co-developed the PRIME+ model which integrated infectious disease prevention, screening, and linkage to medical care into existing PRIME peer programs. The aims of the PRIME+ program are to provide peer-based harm reduction support for persons currently using drugs who present to medical settings, including hospitals, emergency departments, urgent and clinical care to 1. Prevent overdose and injection-related infections; 2. Access hepatitis B, HIV, and hepatitis C testing, and other preventive care; and 3. Link interested participants with substance use treatment and primary care. The PRIME+ pilot was implemented in Umatilla, Malheur, and Klamath counties in 2019-2020. All PRIME sites will transition to the PRIME+ model in 2020-2021.

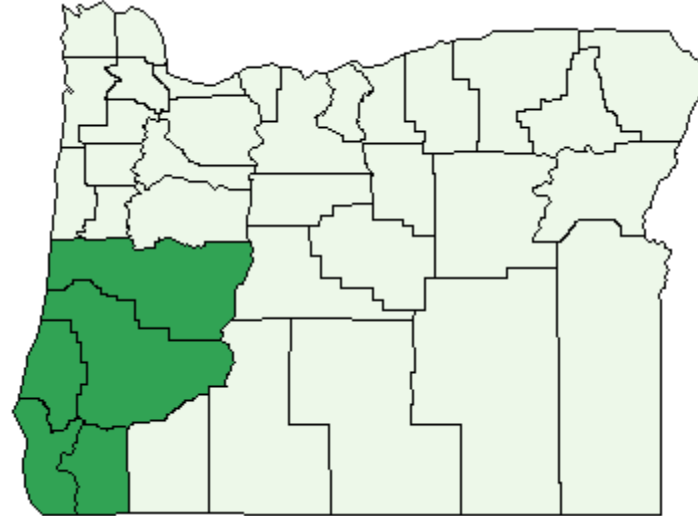

The Oregon HIV/HCV and Opioid Prevention and Engagement (HOPE) study is part of the National Rural Opioids Initiative to address OUD, HCV, and HIV (National Institute on Drug Abuse, 2017). The goal of Oregon HOPE study is to learn about rural drug use in the state, and develop and test a sustainable model for HIV and HCV surveillance and risk reduction for people who use drugs (PWUDs), including intravenous drugs and non-injected opioid and methamphetamine in rural America. The study leverages existing and developing public health and treatment infrastructure to implement a sustainable and a reimbursable certified peer recovery support specialist model. OHA collaborates with Oregon Health and Science University, Comagine Health, AIDS Education Training Center (AETC), HIV Alliance and Bay Area First Step on this project.

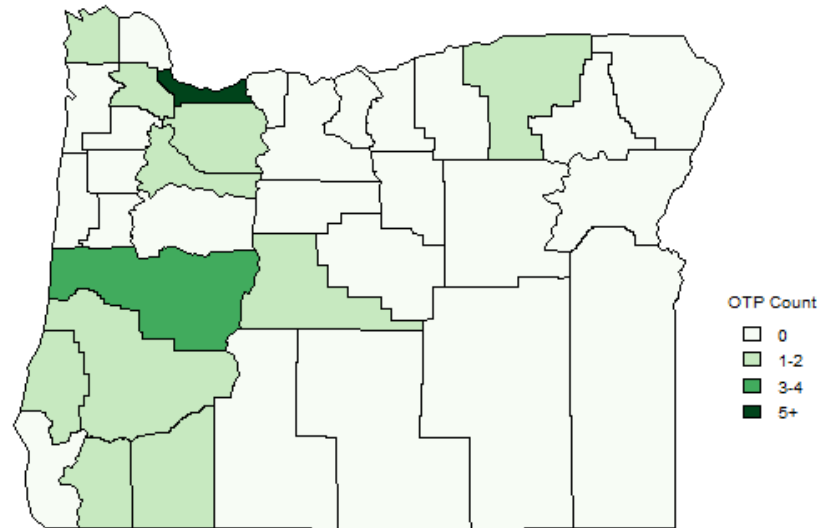

Opioid Treatment Program (OTP)

OTPs provide medications for opioid use disorders (MOUD) for people diagnosed with an opioid-use disorder. MOUD patients also must receive counseling, which can include different forms of behavioral therapy. [SAMHSA’s Division of Pharmacologic Therapies \(DPT\)](#), part of the SAMHSA Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT), oversees the certification of OTPs. OTPs must be certified by SAMHSA and accredited by an independent, SAMHSA-approved accrediting body to dispense opioid treatment medications. All OTPs also must be licensed by the state in which they operate and must register with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).



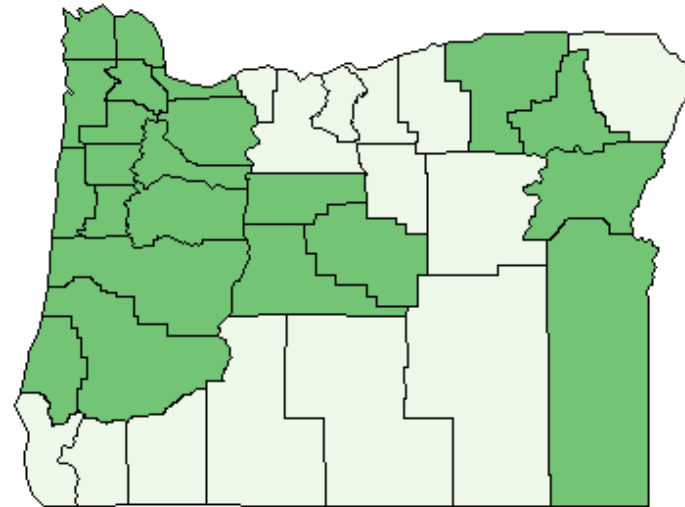
