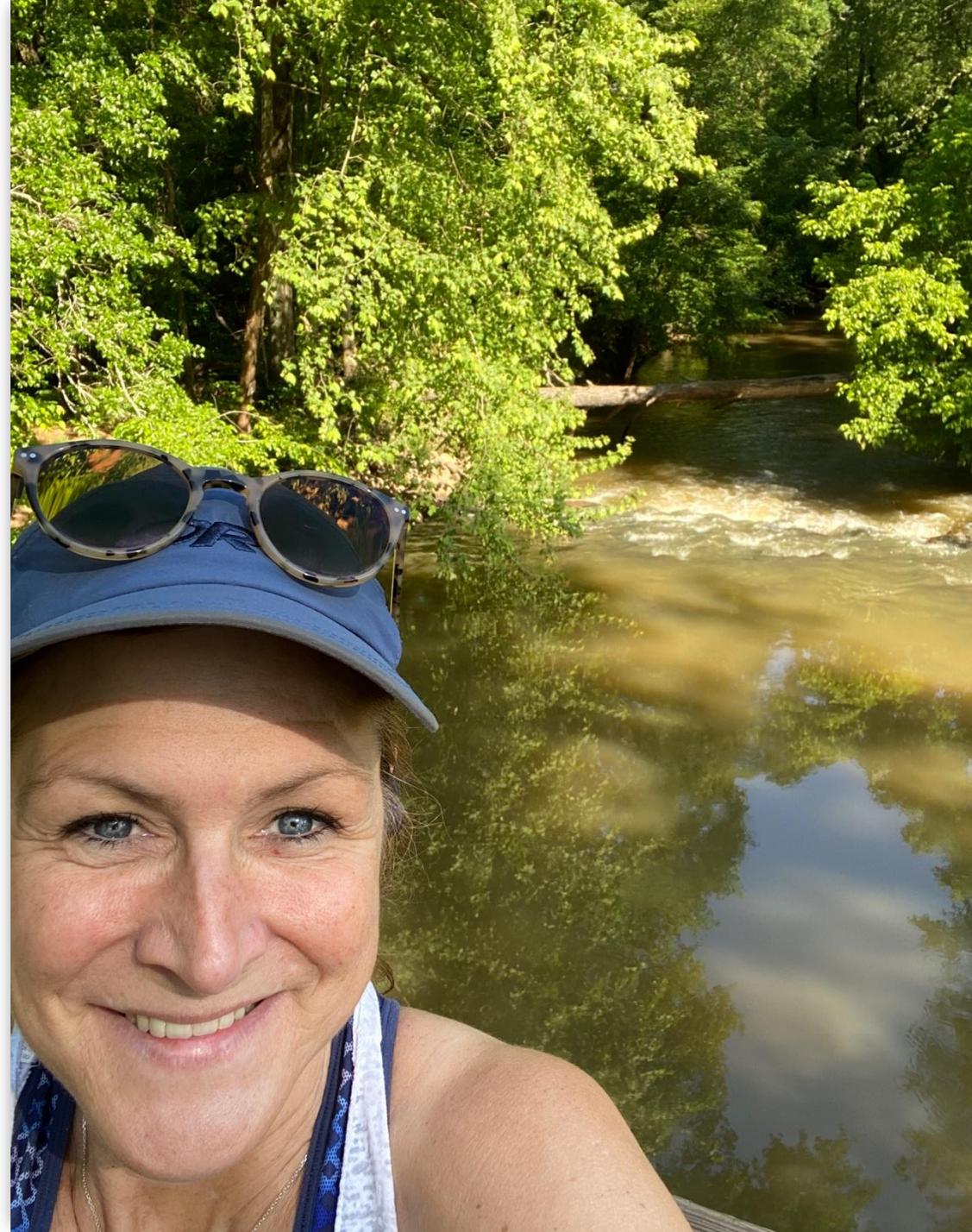

Applying for a New SAMHSA Grant

These resources will help you find and apply for funding opportunities.

IMPORTANT: All applicants must register with NIH's eRA Commons in order to submit an application.

Applicants must also register with the System for Award Management (SAM) and Grants.gov. See Appendix A in the specific SAMHSA Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) for all registration requirements.

It is strongly recommended that applicants start the registration process six (6) weeks in advance of the application due date.

SAMHSA periodically presents a live training webinar for prospective applicants interested in applying to FY 2020 grant programs. The webinar provides information on how to submit applications to SAMHSA using NIH's eRA System, including application and registration processes, requirements and validations, and the post-submission process. Establish the purpose of the project (Example of Project Goal)

1. To increase the number of peers who find meaningful employment upon returning to the community after being incarcerated by developing an employment services program in Lane County.



Examples of SMART Project Objectives:



- ✓ Assist minimum of 20 peers with resume writing, interview assistance, and job placement.
- ✓ Track progress for minimum of 20 peers from initial contact with RCO, throughout the project period (12 months)
- ✓ Collect progress data at three points: First encounter, 6 months, and 12 months.

Budget Narrative Example:

Project Director – Sarah Deschutes 100% LOE. Sarah Deschutes currently coordinates employment services and helps to provide support to volunteers at the organization. Ms. Deschutes is a Certified Peer Specialist – Addictive Diseases (CPS-AD).

As Project Director, Ms. Deschutes will work with peers returning to the community after incarceration. Ms. Deschutes role will be to actively seek out and establish rapport with employers. Ms. Deschutes will assist peers from the first encounter at the organization, in the resume preparation and interview process.

Ms. Deschutes will be responsible for helping each peer in this project find meaningful employment. Ms. Deschutes monthly salary including fringe is \$65,000 and she will devote 100% FTE to this project making his total compensation for the 12-month period of the grant \$65,000

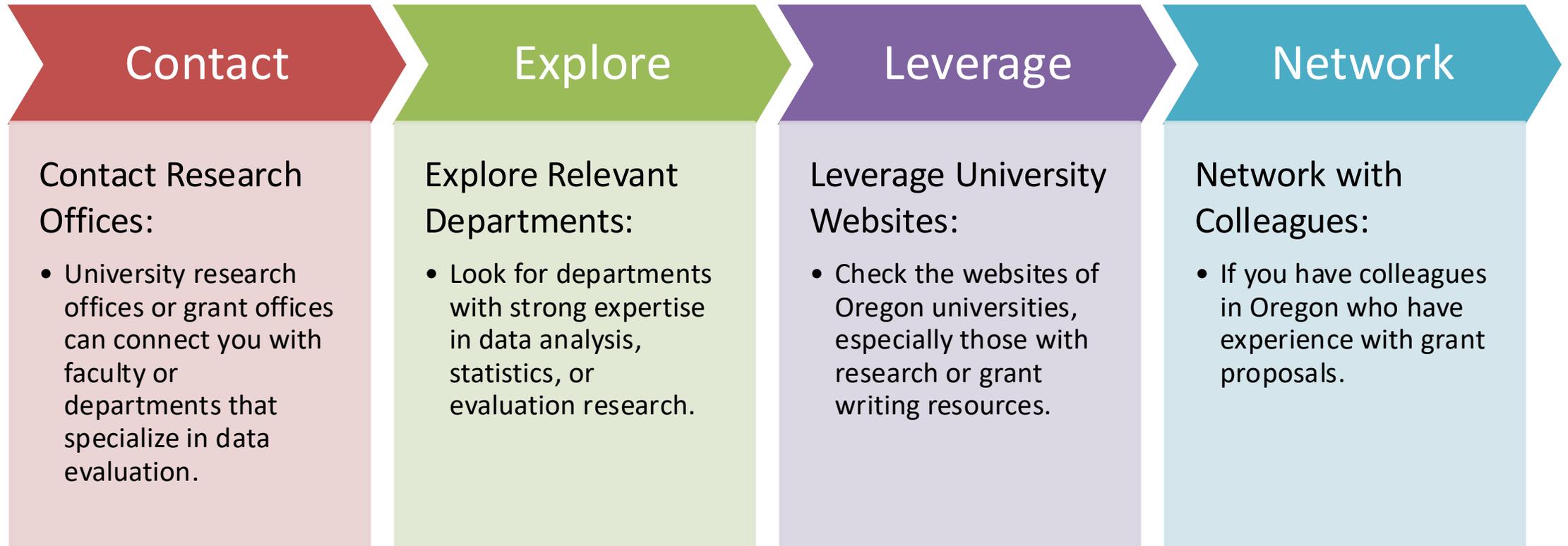


What are indirect costs de minimis?

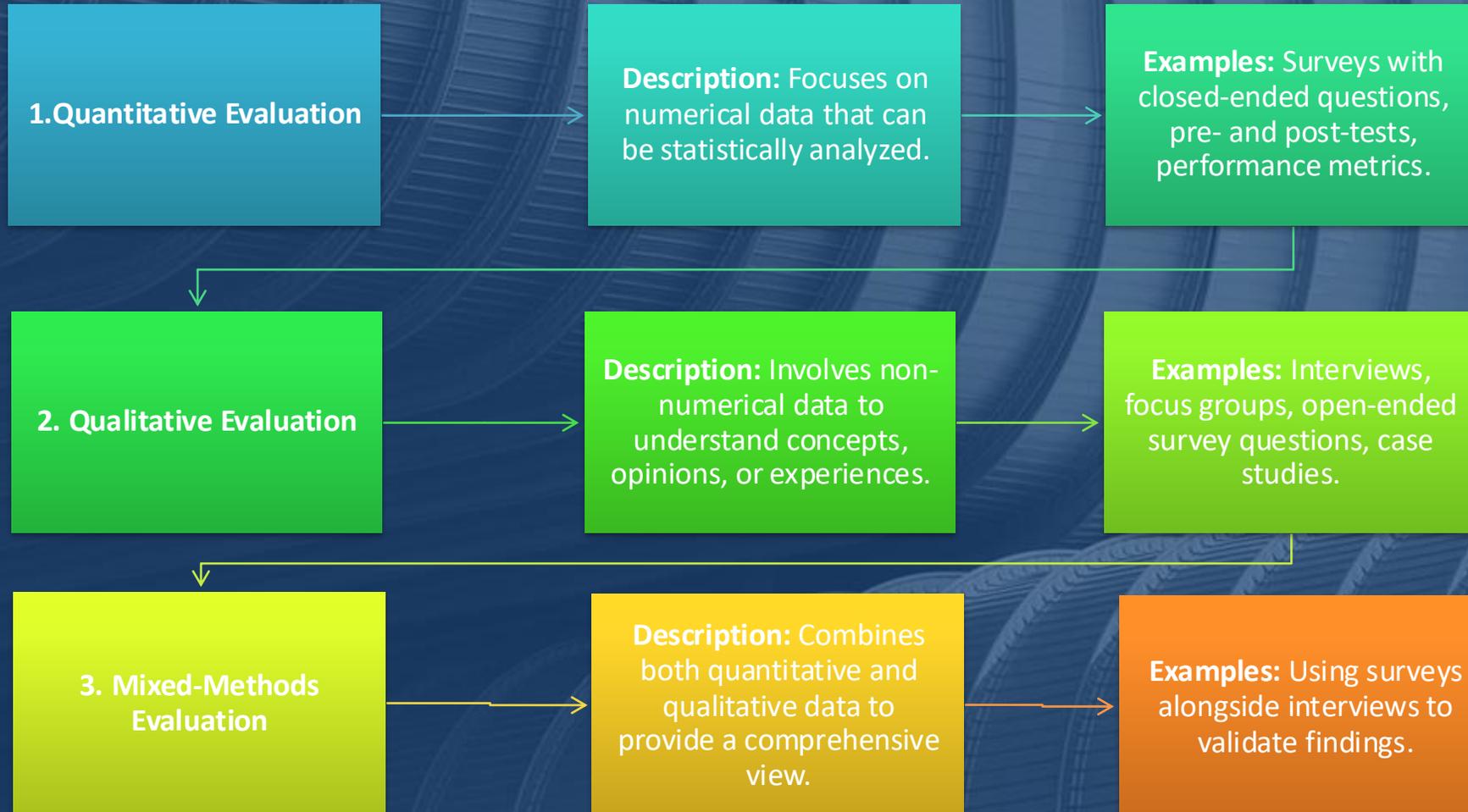


For purposes of the 10% de minimis rate, indirect costs are those costs incurred for a common purpose that are too time-consuming/costly to allocate to a specific cost objective. Examples of indirect costs include office space rental, utilities, and clerical and managerial staff salaries.

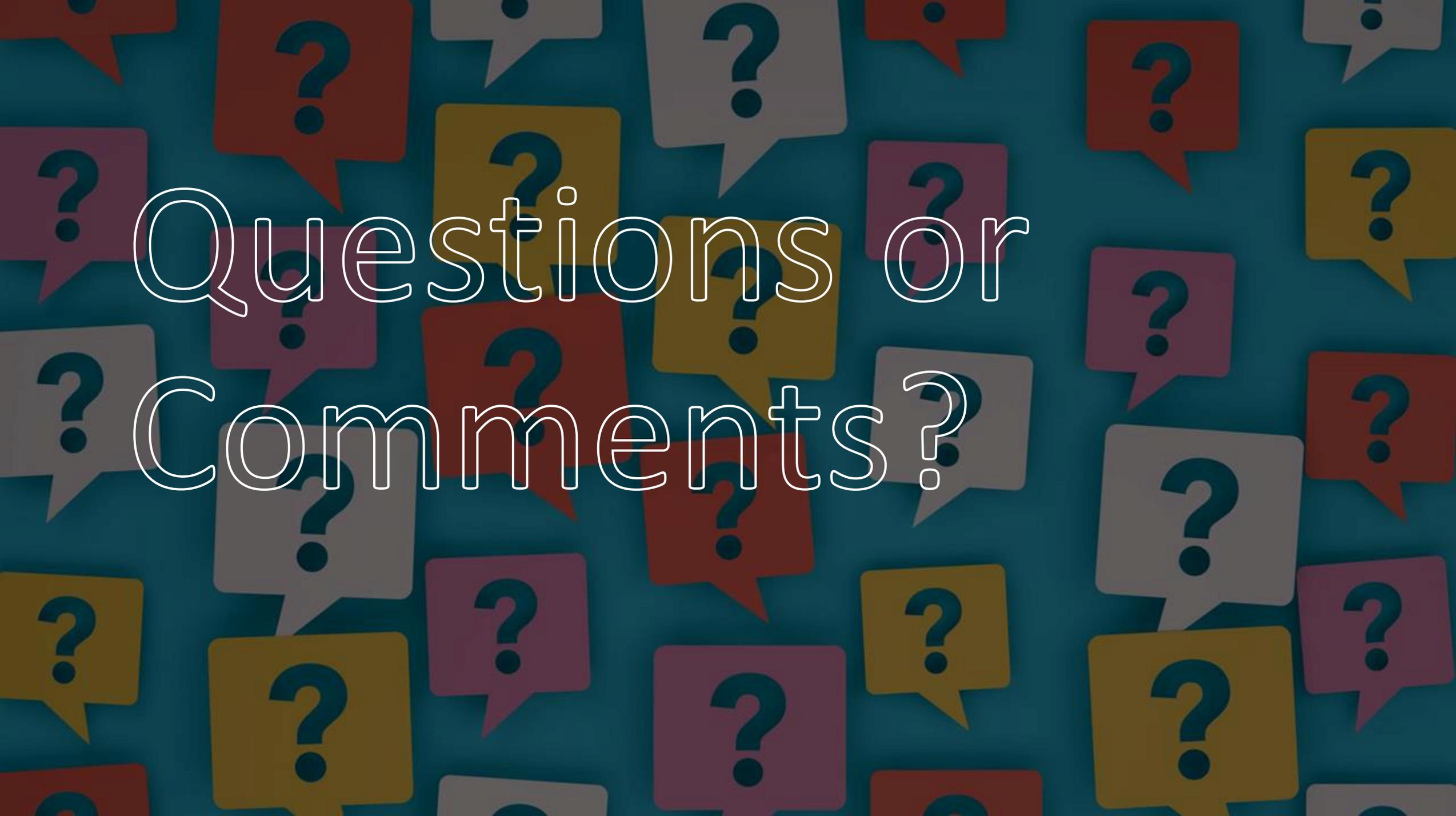
