Naloxone Nasal Spray

Pharmacy Access

- Over the Counter NARCAN® nasal spray 4mg. Find a retailer near you by visiting https://narcan.com/buy. Price per 2-dose box is approximately \$45.00.
- Prescription: Any pharmacist in Oregon is legally allowed to authorize Narcan or naloxone prescriptions to individuals and organizations. There is no limit to the number of kits prescribed. There may, however, be limits to how many naloxone doses will be covered by the insurance carrier. Here is a map of Oregon Pharmacies Distributing Naloxone with the accompanying list.
 - If your organization has any relationship with a retail pharmacy, you may be able to purchase directly there. Most insurance (including OHP) cover the cost of Narcan for individuals; the retail price for one 2-dose box of naloxone nasal spray is about \$165.00.
 - GoodRx often has coupons available for generic nasal naloxone if you need to purchase out-of-pocket through a pharmacy.

Emergent BioSolutions (EBSI)

- The manufacturer of Narcan® which is nasal naloxone medication. Agencies can purchase Narcan® directly from EBSI at public interest prices. The public interest price is currently \$41.00 for a 2-dose box of Narcan®. Now that Narcan is over-the-counter, agencies are not required to have a prescriber's authorization to purchase this product. The public interest price is only available to agencies that will not sell the product OR seek insurance reimbursement.

- To participate in this program, your organization must:
 - 1. Have federal 501(c)(3) non-profit tax-exempt status
 - 2. Be a qualified facility that provides health care to patients regardless of their ability to pay (i.e. FQHC, FQHC Look-Alike, Free Clinic, Community-Based Clinic, etc.)
 - Comply with all State Board of Pharmacy regulations in storing and dispensing medications
 - 4. Have a Medical Director (a physician or pharmacist) with a valid state license
 - 5. Dispense donated products to patients within the United States
- From Direct Relief: Partners submit requests for donated products through an ordering website. Our pharmacist then reviews the requests received and allocates the products based on patient population and product availability. Due to the nature of our inventory, we cannot guarantee that every request will be filled in its entirety, but we do try to meet the need as best we can. The products are then sent out of the warehouse in Santa Barbara, California via FedEx directly to partners in all 50 states, D.C., and territories.
