

Packaging Attractive to Minors

DID YOU KNOW?

It's Oregon state law that all types of inhalant delivery systems (IDS), commonly referred to as e-cigarettes, must not be packaged in a manner that is attractive to minors (Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 431A.175(2)(f)). See Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 333-015-0305 and OAR 333-015-0357 for definitions associated with IDS packaging requirements. **Starting July 1, 2024**, the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Tobacco Retail License program **will begin enforcing this law through compliance inspections.**

WHAT IS CONSIDERED IDS PACKAGING ATTRACTIVE TO MINORS

Features of packaging that may reasonably appear to be attractive to minors include but are not limited to the following:


- The shape of any animal, commercially recognizable toy, sports equipment, commercially recognizable candy, or images of minors; or
- A commercially recognizable toy, sports equipment, or commercially recognizable candy attached to the package.

See OAR 333-015-0357.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING COMPLIANCE INSPECTIONS

During an inspection, compliance specialists will look at a sample of IDS to ensure that products sold comply with the IDS packaging attractive to minors rule (<u>OAR 333-015-0357</u>). Review <u>OAR 333-015-0357</u> for specific packaging attractive to minors requirements.
