
### QUARTER 1 UPDATES

Happy New Year! Q1 is ramping up as many annual reports are updated early in the quarter, including childhood, adolescent and adult population-based immunization rates. Additional changes to dashboards in the next quarter include: (1) the release of the Infant Hepatitis B Immunization Dashboard, which will report rates of birth hepatitis B immunizations at the state, county, and birth facility level, as well as facility level rates for screening the birth parent for hepatitis B; and (2) the combined Respiratory Immunization Dashboard.

This is your friendly reminder that immunizations are one of the greatest public health achievements, preventing tens of thousands of deaths and millions of cases of vaccine preventable disease.

### NEW DATA HIGHLIGHTS




### Pregnancy Immunization Dashboard is now live!

The Pregnancy Immunization Dashboard provides immunization rates for Tdap, RSV, COVID-19 and flu during pregnancy. Annual trend data is available as well, with some rates dating back to 2020. This dashboard will be updated on an annual basis.



## Flu immunization coverage falling behind previous seasons

Despite the increasing threat and surging flu cases across the state, Oregon is seeing lower flu immunization coverage in the 2025-2026 season compared to previous seasons. The Flu Immunization Dashboard now provides weekly updates on flu immunization rates down to the ZIP code-level.
