IPAT Revitalization Aaron	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Aaron presented a recap of the discussion from previous meeting about direction for IPAT future. A revised charter draft will be presented at the June meeting. Joell Archibald, who serves as an Innovator Agent (liaison between CCOs and OHA) and Carrie Beck from Health Insight gave brief overviews of their organizations as potential new members. <p>Discussion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Need to have the updated charter before we start extensive recruitment to ensure we are getting the correct mix. Given the focus on maternal vaccination, would like to see a perinatal representative on IPAT <p>Decision:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Approved Joell and Carrie as new members

<p>ALERT IIS Update Jenne</p>	<p>Jenne presented some examples of data generated in ALERT IIS to demonstrate the kinds of data available and who might use it.</p> <p>Other suggestions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reminders for recalling patients for their second HPV dose? – yes • Local health department access to provider data – yes, with provider permission • Mapping by other criteria than zip code; i.e. high school catchment area <p>Discussion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can we find those providers that are vaccinating but do not report to ALERT IIS or get state-supplied vaccine? • Data exchange with Washington is not working due to technical issues on the Washington side. Work is ongoing. • Work continues with Idaho for data exchange with them. • There is a need for outreach to providers that do immunizations but do not know about ALERT IIS; i.e. EDs or long term care facilities • ALERT IIS has been invaluable for schools.
<p>PH Modernization Sara B</p>	<p>Public health modernization is intended to ensure the public health system operates efficiently, is aligned with health system transformation, and is set up to provide public health protections for every person in the state.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Framework adopted by the Legislature in 2015 • 2017-19 - \$5 million in OHA budget PH modernization (\$250k to OIP) <p>OIP portion priorities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ ALERT Forecaster Updates/Replacements ○ Regional Quality Improvement Meetings ○ School Module Electronic Reporting Assessment ○ ALERT IIS Training Materials ○ Data Quality in ALERT IIS <p>Eight metrics for accountability used to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Track progress toward the modernization of Oregon’s public health system; • Bring focus to Oregon’s population health priorities; • Highlight areas where public health and other sectors can work together to achieve shared goals. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Not tied to LPHA incentive payments at this time but may be in the future.

Imm Hot Topics	<p>School Law Advisory Committee: Rule changes this fall are all minor administrative changes at this time. Meeting in May to revisit meningococcal vaccines for school entry, at the request of the legislature.</p> <p>Legislation: Short session year One immunization-related bill - HB 4157 would mandate that certain vaccines be covered by insurers at specific ages. The ages listed for insurers to cover vaccines are not in line with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. The bill would also require OHA to add meningococcal conjugate (age 11 and up) and meningococcal B (age 10 and up) vaccines to requirements for school attendance.</p> <p>Immunization coalition: Received a proposal from Legacy. Contract negotiations are underway. Updates will be provided as more information develops.</p> <p>HPV Coalition Update: HPV Summit scheduled for May 31. Update requests sent out for work reported during previous Roundtable and results will be presented at the Summit. OIP will share information as it develops.</p> <p>VFC On-demand Ordering: This will not be an option with current staffing.
