<p>ALERT IIS Update Jenne</p>	<p>Jenne provided an historical overview of ALERT IIS for new IPAT members</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Began in 1996 because of the work of partner organizations like those on IPAT • Expanded to lifetime in 2008, due to legislative changes spearheaded by these same partner organizations • Transitioned to new platform in 2010 • Requirements for IIS Maintenance annually • Upcoming new enhancements include AFIX-IIS Integration and technology refresh scheduled for this summer. • 99% VFC providers • 91% private providers • ~90% of data submitted via an EHR interface <p>Discussion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why is there not a national registry? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Fifty different state governments, a variety of data systems, different priorities. Oregon is working on interstate data exchange with Washington and Idaho. • What are the barriers to bi-directional data exchange? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ <i>Funding, multiple data platforms/formats. Working toward national standards for data. Meaningful Use has provided funding to move forward to national data standards.</i> • The percentage of clinics who do bi-directional exchange is changing constantly.
<p>School Law Data Stacy</p>	<p>Update on 2018 school exclusion process</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 692,004 children covered under school law • 24,725 exclusion orders issued • 4,349 children excluded • 7.5% Exemption rate for 2017-2018 (for at least one vaccine) • School and county level data available on website at www.healthoregon.org/immdatamap <p>Discussion:</p> <p>Is there data on types of providers providing vaccine education? <i>No, do not collect that data. Majority of exemptors use the education module.</i></p> <p>Form only records that provider provided vaccine education.</p> <p>The school level data is very helpful and team members have shared it with a variety of individuals</p> <p>Other states are seeing a rise in exemption rates also.</p> <p>Are there other patterns; private/public; rural/urban, large/small facility, etc? <i>Yes, higher exemption rate in private schools, and smaller facilities.</i></p> <p>Would like to see the presentation sent out after the meetings</p> <p>Data for 7th grade also available</p> <p>Medical exemption rate is ~ 0.1-0.2 %</p> <p>Action: Send presentations out with minutes or post on web, if file size is an issue</p>
