Public Comment	<p>Six members of the public provided comment. Partial list of topics included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• VAERS and vaccine safety (access to data, data as an outcome measure)</li> <li>• Experience of being refused service at a provider's office due to not immunizing children</li> <li>• School exclusion practices in Lane County during pertussis outbreak</li> </ul> <p>Review of ICAN report and request of DHHS</p>
Knowledge, attitudes and beliefs of tribal members around immunizations	<p>Clarice presented on a series of focus groups around immunization questions.</p> <p>3 focus groups – 1 (OR), 2 (WA), N = 36 participants</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Primarily younger parents</li> <li>• Smaller number of older parents/grandparents</li> <li>• At least one healthcare provider (nurse, nurse assistant or medical assistant) who was also a tribal member</li> </ul> <p>Limitations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Focus groups in only 3 communities, may not be representative of all NW communities</li> <li>• Some focus groups included HCW from the clinic, which may have introduced bias</li> <li>• None of the focus groups was from a Tribe served directly by HIS</li> </ul> <p>Conclusions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Adequate patient education about immunizations was identified as an important concern</li> <li>• Fear of vaccines (ingredients, side effects) and mistrust of government and pharmaceutical companies was an important concern</li> <li>• Improving patient and provider education regarding immunization is needed</li> </ul>
Immunizations Hot Topics / Roundtable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Team member heard about recent measles cases from patient. What is the process for reporting VPDs? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ No formal process; depends on event. Strive to find a balance between too much messaging and getting information out to correct parties. There was a press release and a HAN alert concerning measles cases.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Can IPAT help with distributing press releases, etc.? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Yes</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Public comment was a good addition. IPAT meetings will be posted on OHA's public meeting site and will include information on how to participate in the public comment section.</li> <li>• Hilary will be retiring from IPAT. She has identified a candidate to take her spot.</li> </ul>
