Background

OHA has identified fifteen Vaccine Redistribution Hubs for COVID-19 vaccine across the state to widen access and prevent waste. All Hubs provide the Pfizer vaccine, most provide other COVID-19 vaccines as well.

Each Hub serves as a central location to intake vaccines, store them for brief periods of time, repackage into smaller batches, and redistribute to clinics and other administering sites. Hubs will allow vaccinators such as clinics, pharmacies, and public health sites to have smaller quantities of the [Pfizer vaccine](#) available in their conventional vaccine freezers and refrigerators, where they may be safely stored for up to 6 weeks. In addition, most Hubs are distributing Moderna and two Hubs also distribute J&J vaccine. This allows providers to access smaller or larger quantities of these vaccines that are already on hand in the state.

Redistribution Hubs provide COVID-19 vaccine to each region's enrolled pandemic vaccine providers, the "Spokes." The ordering process is summarized in the table above. OHA is covering the operating costs of any Hubs that request reimbursement, there is no cost to the Spokes for this service. OHA has produced Hub specific Fact Sheets that provide details about the ordering and delivery process. Note for sites deciding how much of the Pfizer vaccine to order: As of May 19, 2021, the FDA has authorized Pfizer vaccine to be stored for up to 2 weeks in a conventional vaccine freezer (-25 to -15C) plus up to one month in a vaccine refrigerator (2 to 8C). This means that facilities without an ultra-cold freezer can safely store the Pfizer vaccine on site for up to 45 days.
